## Judge Reports Auto Damage

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg has reported to city police that his car, a 1940 Olds sedan, was slightly damaged yesterday morning when struck by a 1942 Ford sedan driven by Ernestine H. Gracey, stenographer, of 2640 Eberlein.

Vandenberg's car was parked in his N. 3rd street driveway between Washington and Jefferson, the judge reported, with approximately one foot of the rear of the car jutting out past the curb.

Mrs. Gracey was coming south on 3rd about 15 miles an hour with her vision obscured by an icy windshield and rammed into the parked car. The right front fender of her car was crumpled and about \$50 damage was done to Vandenberg's car.
