

# Allied Commander Plans More Active Measures To Restore Order In Java

BATAVIA, Java, Dec. 27 (AP) Lt. Gen. Sir Philip Christison, allied commander in the Netherlands East Indies, informed Indonesian leaders today that he planned "more active measures" to restore order in strife-torn Java.

He also called on the Indonesians to place under his command whatever units of the Indonesian peace preservation corps (TKR) he might need to assist British troops in suppressing disorders.

Christison outlined his plans at a conference with Premier Sutan Sjahrir and Information Minister Amir Sjarifuddin of the unrecognized Indonesian republic as large-scale fighting flared anew in Bandung, Java's summer capital.

**Heavy Fighting**  
In one sector of Bandung British Mahatma troops cleared an Indonesian training center after six hours of heavy house-to-house fighting. They found a well-organized defense system of trenches, trip wires, booby-traps, mines, road blocks and snipers.

In another sector Gurkha troops, with tank support, attacked a suburban area held by Indonesians, but were forced to withdraw.

Other outbreaks were reported in Soerabaya, where 60 nationalists attacked a British patrol base with machineguns and grenades, wounding two British soldiers. In the vicinity of Semarang, two former Japanese 75 mm. guns shelled British positions.

**Statement Issued**  
Shortly after going into the meeting with Sjahrir and Sjarifuddin, Christison issued a statement declaring that British troops in Java were there "only in pursuance of an Anglo-American decision allocating the responsibility for disarming and repatriating the Japanese, and rescuing European and Eurasian prisoners and internees."

In London Prime Minister William Schernherhorn of the Netherlands and Acting Governor-General Hubertus J. Van Mook of the Netherlands East Indies continued talks with Prime Minister Attlee on a settlement of the Indonesian dispute. Attlee, who is said to be anxious to withdraw British troops from the Indies, was reported to have urged the Dutch to state specifically their intentions with regard to Indonesian demands for independence.

SEATTLE, Dec. 28 (AP)—Seattle's striking printers, meeting last night to consider a new proposal from the publishers of the city's three idle newspapers, adjourned with the announcement that there had not been time enough to notify members of the session.

The proposal, details of which were not disclosed, will be considered at the Typographical union's regular Sunday meeting, the printers said. They have demanded a daily wage increase of \$2.95.
