

Japs View With Dismay Big Three Decision For 4-Power Control Council

TOKYO, Dec. 28 (AP)—Japanese viewed with surprise and dismay today the Big Three decision for establishment of a four-power occupation council for Japan, which most observers regarded as a Russian victory in international bargaining.

1946 Budget Adopted By Commission

PORTLAND, Dec. 28 (AP)—The state highway commission has adopted a 1946 budget calling for expenditure of over \$25,000,000—about \$9,000,000 less than estimated cash available.

Revenue is expected to reach nearly \$35,000,000; net gasoline taxes, license and other fees \$14,000,000; deferred maintenance fund \$13,500,000; federal cooperation funds \$7,000,000.

The commission, meeting here yesterday, listed these major expenditures: capital outlay including right-of-way, construction, improvements, \$16,500,000; maintenance \$6,500,000; operations \$1,400,000; debt service \$1,221,000; new equipment \$300,000.

The \$9,000,000 reserve will be held to match future federal appropriations.

The tourist information bureau's \$85,000 budget was approved after John A. Laling and Harold B. Say described Oregon's plans to attract tourists.

Survey Authorized
R. H. Baldock, engineer, was authorized to survey Sullivan's Gulch in East Portland for a possible express highway.

A complaint involving the last commission meeting, when several important bids were rejected as too high, came from S. S. Montague, president of the Portland chapter, Associated General Contractors of America.

He declared the state's estimates were based on "obsolete cost records," and "unwarranted and unfair publicity concerning the rejection is not justified."

Baldock denied that estimates were improperly prepared. Commission Chairman T. H. Banfield said the publicity "gave only facts."

Sen. Dorris Eugene, protested that the financial report submitted when the state charged him \$19.25 in taxes after he donated 78 acres on the McKenzie for a state park. The commission voted an investigation to see if state and federal income tax laws can be amended to avoid future incidents of this type.

A charge of failure to yield the right of way has been filed against William Donald Daugherty, 19, a soldier who lives on route 1, following the traffic crash yesterday morning at Spring and Oak which put two women in the Klamath Valley hospital.

Mrs. N. M. Newport and Mrs. Arthur H. Denison are still confined to the hospital with lacerations and shock.

Cars driven by Daugherty and Charles Arthur Denison, 20, 5055 S. 6th, crashed at the intersection and the two women, riding in the Denison car, were injured.
