

# U. S.: Treaty Would Halt Aggression

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—All Latin American governments except Argentina today pondered a United States-proposed treaty which would provide for concerted military action to thwart or put down aggression anywhere in this hemisphere.

The document, made public by Latin American diplomats, will be considered at the forthcoming Rio de Janeiro conference scheduled for early spring. Diplomatic authorities consider this country's suggestion as a running mate to the recent Uruguayan proposal calling for collective action in this hemisphere against any nation which disregards its international obligations or denies human rights to its own people.

**Military Side**  
The United States' treaty, these authorities say, would take care of the purely military side of aggression, while the Uruguayan proposal would deal with the political phases of conditions leading to war. The Uruguayan plan, however, has received a frigid Latin reception although this country pledged its "unequivocal" support.

The suggested military treaty is designed to continue in force the act of Chapultepec, adopted at the Mexico City inter-American conference last March.

While calling for the peaceful settlement of disputes, the proposal provides for immediate assistance by the Americas in cases of armed attack either

from within or without the hemisphere.

As soon as possible thereafter consultations would be held "to examine measures that may have already been taken in agreeing upon collective measures." A two-thirds vote would be necessary for agreement.

## Lieu Of Tax Bill Backed

County officials here hope to enlist strong backing for the Senator Guy Cordon federal grants bill now before congress during the meeting of the governor's special committee here tomorrow.

The bill provides for federal payments in lieu of county taxes lost by the transfer of county lands to national forests, and such transfers and the resulting decrease in county revenue will be one of the major topics for discussion at the open meeting.

Klamath county has been a heavy loser by the removal of these lands transferred to the federal government in payment for cutting rights in national forests. Two sources of income are cut off.

First, the lands are removed from the tax rolls, and, second, the payment to the county of 25 per cent of the cutting rights payment is evaded when no money changes hands.

During the past year, as an example, about \$327,000 worth of Shelvin-Hixon lands have been transferred to the federal government cutting some \$8000 from the tax income, according to county court figures.

## Third Slide Halts Trains

Southbound traffic over the Southern Pacific lines was held in Klamath Falls today as a third slide just east of Dunsmuir in northern California disrupted movements in that area. Trains 15 and 17, southbound out of Portland, were permitted to leave here at 2:20 and 2:30 p. m. today after a forced layover of several hours.

Officials here said that a temporary or "shoo-fly" track was being built around the slide area which was larger than that of the two previous slides. It was not known here this afternoon whether the temporary track had been completed but if it has not, SP said today, the passengers will be carried by bus around the slide and then continue south.

The slide occurred sometime around midnight Wednesday. First word received here said

that unless complications arose including more dirt from the hillside weakened by heavy rains, the track should be in operation around 5 p. m.

All northern traffic movements were normal including those in the flooded areas of the Willamette valley.

## Bureau Issues Storm Warning

SEATTLE, Jan. 3 (AP)—The weather bureau today issued a storm warning for the area from Port Townsend in the mouth of the Columbia, for strong to gale force southerly winds this afternoon and tonight. It hoisted smaller warnings along the Oregon coast.
