

Truman Adopts FDR's Fireside Chat Technique In Effort To Dislodge Legislature From Congress Snags

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—President Truman adopted the "Fireside Chat" technique of his White House predecessor today in the hope of dislodging key labor and other legislative proposals from Capitol Hill snags.

Mr. Truman takes to the radio at 10 p. m., eastern standard time tonight with an appeal to the people at a time when his administration is plagued with strikes and threatening walk-outs.

One of his most recent proposals was a recommendation to place the force of law behind fact-finding boards to permit them to weigh disputes affecting

important nation-wide industries. Both strikes and lockouts would be barred while the fact-finding procedures were in operation.

Lay Framework
Mr. Truman's championship of this and other legislation tonight may well figure prominently in next summer's congressional campaigns. Some of his associates express the view that the 30-minute speech will lay the framework for democratic election campaigns, especially in industrial states.

With the CIO United Auto Workers out at General Motors plants, the CIO United Steel Workers set to strike January 14 and other industrial strife looming large, attention was focused on the labor aspects of the address. Mr. Truman has said, however, that it will cover his over-all legislative program and the state of the union.

Tone "Firm"
One White House official said the tone of the speech will be "firm" in its adherence to the legislative framework the president sketched for congress as long ago as last September, but

that it will be "conciliatory" in its presentation. Mr. Truman, this official said, asking not to be named, wants to be persuasive without being "dictatorial."

Among his earlier proposals that ran up against militant opposition on Capitol Hill were attempts to win legislative approval for increased unemployment compensation up to a \$25 weekly maximum, a so-called "full employment" bill and a permanent fair employment practice commission.
