

Death March Order Given By Homma

MANILA, Jan. 4 (AP)—Lt. Gen. Masaharu Homma himself gave the order for the infamous death march that killed thousands on the agony-strewn route from Bataan to Camp O'Donnell in April, 1942, one of his staff officers testified at Homma's war-crimes trial today.

Neither Homma nor his staff cared what happened to the emaciated American and Filipino prisoners, the witness, Lt. Col. Michio Kitayama, asserted. Kitayama, a communications officer at Homma's 14th Imperial Army headquarters, said he saw the march from several successive vantage points along the road.

Kitayama, who was with Homma throughout the Philippines campaign also testified that he believed Homma received word from Tokyo that Manila had been declared an open city by the Americans—but not until December 30, 1941, three days after bombers under Homma's command had smashed at civilian buildings in the ancient walled city.

Maj. Gen. Toshimitsu Takatsu, also on Homma's staff, told the commission earlier that he had headed the handling of prisoners of war. He said he expected 30,000 Americans and Filipinos would surrender in Bataan, and was surprised when more than 60,000 appeared. He said only 50,000 Japanese troops, short of food and many of them ill with malaria, opposed the Bataan defenders.

The prisoners were "well," he said, as they began their march.

Flood Damage At \$6 Million

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 4 (AP)—An unofficial estimate of last week's Willamette valley flood damage was placed at \$6,000,000 today by the district army engineers' office here.

The formal damage will not come in for several weeks, officials said. They stated that a rough land-air survey showed about 360,000 acres inundated, compared with 34,000 in 1943, when damage was computed at \$5,700,000.

This year's flood was worse in upriver areas, but less severe downstream than in 1943, officials reported.

Veterans Overflow Bremerton Navy Base

BREMERTON, Jan. 4 (AP)—An overflow of khaki and olive drab at the United States naval base does not mean an army-navy merger has been completed.

The USS Makin Island arrived at Seattle Wednesday with 1184 overseas air force veterans, but transportation and housing shortages permitted debarking only 125.

The navy had the big carrier scheduled for overhaul here and the work could not be delayed, so the vessel moved cross-sound. Fifty-three veterans were debarked yesterday and the rest were to "escape" to the army today.

OSC Registration Limited Only By Housing Conditions

CORVALLIS, Jan. 4 (AP)—Winter term registration at Oregon State college will be limited only by housing conditions, officials said today, reporting enrollment already has reached 2983—a 70 per cent increase from last year.

The total is 236 above the second day of fall term. Hundreds of veterans—many from out of state—crowded into college offices, and officials predicted scores of students were yet to come. Many men were expected to enroll late, partially offsetting the odds now in favor of women—1593 to 1390.

Although lack of room reservations kept some prospects from the campus, others took a chance and—thanks to townspeople and faculty members who offered spare rooms—were able to find space.
