Plan Building
Plans have been adopted and sufficient funds are on hand or pledged to begin building the new church in the spring. An acre of land is owned by the church at 4431 S. 6th, where a modern manse has been constructed and a foundation laid for the church. An auditorium to seat about 300 will be part of the new structure and a Christian education building of two stories to care for a Sunday school enrollment of 300. There will be both Girl and Boy Scout rooms, a woman's parlor for missionary meetings and a large community hall for social gatherings where the whole community will be welcome.

The Rev. Mr. Mitchellmore has discontinued holding services at Mt. Laki and is devoting all his time to Peace Memorial. For the present Chaplain Gilmer of the Marine Barracks is supplying the Mt. Laki church.
