

Many Important Federal, State And County Elections On 1946 Calendar

Elections to fill important county, state and federal offices are on the Oregon political calendar for this year although 1946 is an off year as far as the nation's highest political offices are concerned.

The big local voting will come in filling the circuit judgeship at present held down by Judge David R. Vandenberg, who is expected to stand for re-election. The bench is non-partisan and pays \$6000 a year for a six-year term.

Primary election date, when each political party selects candidates, is May 17, and the general balloting comes November 3.

Two representatives to the state legislature are also to be chosen in November. Present incumbents are Rube Toole, democrat, and Harry Semon, republican.

Lowell Stockman of Pendleton, congressman from the Oregon second district which includes Klamath county, is expected to run for re-election on the republican ticket.

Governor Election

Gubernatorial voting also comes up this year and Governor Earl Snell will probably be a republican candidate to serve four more years. Also open for election will be the offices of secretary of state, superintendent of public instruction, commissioner of the bureau of labor and a supreme court justice.

In Klamath county Republican Fred Pope of Fort Klamath has hinted that he will run again for county commissioner. The offices of assessor, held by Democrat Newton Nelson, and surveyor, occupied by Republican Frank Z. Howard, will also appear on the ballot. These are all for four-year terms.

A justice of the peace and a constable are to be chosen this year from the towns, Odell, Lost River, Klamath Falls, Sprague River, Tulelake, Yainax and Wood River districts. The justice is elected for six years and constable for two.

Candidates for state offices must file petitions for nomination with the secretary of state before March 8, and candidates for county positions must file with the county clerk by the same date.

If a candidate does not wish to circulate petitions to have his name placed on the primary ballot he may, not later than March 8, put up the following fees at the time of filing his declaration of intention to run: Representative in congress \$100

State offices \$100
Circuit judge \$50
State representative \$10
County offices \$20
Justice of the peace, constable and district offices within the county \$5

A candidate wishing to have his name placed on the primary ballot without putting up the prescribed fee must secure at least 5 per cent of the total electors within the county by petition. Candidates for justice of the peace or constable are required to have at least 10 per cent of the total electors within their district on petition.

Two precinct committees, one man and one woman, will be chosen in each precinct at the general election this year instead of the primary voting as before. Declarations should be filed with the county clerk not later than August 12.

Over 8000 voting registrations in Klamath county have been cancelled during the past year because the electors failed to vote in either of the past two general elections. Registration books are now open and will remain open until 5 p. m., April 16, at the county clerk's office.

San Diego Feels Sharp Earthquake

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Jan. 8 (AP)—A sharp earthquake, quite noticeable by occupants on upper floors of office buildings, was felt in San Diego shortly before 11 a. m. today. No damage was reported.

The quake was recorded on the seismograph of Fred Robinson, local seismologist, at 10:53.15 a. m. It was of 25 seconds duration with an east-west motion. The tremor had an intensity of 3 on a scale of 12. Location of the tremor was not known.

January 15 Tax Questions Answered By U. S. Experts

1. If I must file a 1945 Declaration of Estimated Tax on January 15, what form should I use? You have a choice between filing an estimate on Form 1040-ES and filing your annual income tax return on Form 1040. You can get either form from the nearest collector of Internal Revenue.

2. What form should I use to change an estimate I filed last spring? You have the same choice between Form 1040-ES and Form 1040. If you use Form 1040-ES, write the word "Amended" at the top of the form.

3. What is the difference between Form 1040-ES and Form 1040? Form 1040-ES is a special form for estimated tax. Form 1040 is the regular blank for filing annual income tax returns.

4. How can I decide which form is best for me? If by January 15, you do not have exact figures on your 1945 income and deductions, it is best that you use Form 1040-ES. In that case you will have to also file your regular 1945 return by March 15. If you are in a position to file your regular return as early as January 15, you can file Form 1040 then and it will serve both as your Declaration and also as your return.

5. Does the new tax law, passed by Congress a few weeks ago, change any of this procedure? No, your declaration or return is for 1945 and the new law applies only to income received in 1946.

6. Do members or veterans of the armed forces have to file declarations? Not as to their pay for active service in the armed forces (except REGULAR officers serving within the United States). However, if they have any civilian income, it is treated the same as the income of any other taxpayer.

Father Gets Boy's Custody

Upholding a Twin Falls, Idaho, court order, Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg yesterday restored the custody of a four-year-old boy to the youngster's father after the mother had brought the child to Klamath Falls in disregard of the Idaho ruling.

The mother, Ella Mae Wygal, is plaintiff in a divorce suit still pending in Twin Falls and the baby was placed in her custody temporarily. On January 4, the Idaho court ordered the little boy, Robert Ambrose, given to the father, Francis Wygal, but the mother had left Idaho with the child and come to Klamath Falls. Francis Wygal came here and retained an attorney, D. E. Van Vactor, who brought the case into court on a writ of habeas corpus.

As soon as he was given custody of his son and received a certified copy of the court ruling Wygal and the boy left for Twin Falls.

A quiet, routine day is passing for Orville Hamilton's first day as official chief of Klamath Falls police. Hamilton was appointed by the city council last night after serving a year as acting chief.

Six drunks, one vagrant and one Indian charged with possession of intoxicating liquor appeared in court this morning, and eight parking tickets were paid. Several minor accidents were reported in the past 24 hours. The jail now has 30 inmates.

Underwood To Quit Business

Clarence H. Underwood, pioneer Klamath Falls merchant and businessman, today announced his retirement from business with the sale of Underwood's photo service and Camera shop to Eugene Baillie and Erik Carlson, returned World War 11 veterans.

Baillie and Carlson, both well known here, took over the operation of the two businesses today. The two men are brothers-in-law.

Underwood came to Klamath Falls in January, 1906. For 35 years he operated the Underwood pharmacy which he sold to Walgreen's. The photo service was retained and moved upstairs in the Underwood building at 7th and Main. On October 16, Underwood purchased the Comart studio and the Eastman Kodak dealership from James Floyd at 727 Main. Floyd recently moved his commercial photography business to his residence.

Discharged Baillie was with Klamath Theatres for 15 years prior to entering the Seabees. He was discharged from the navy following 26 months in the service. 11 months spent in the Russell Islands and seven months on Okinawa. He was with the first Seabees to land on Okinawa and served during the invasion months.

Carlson, employe of the First National bank, is a veteran of the European campaign. He is a life long resident of Klamath Falls and was overseas with the U. S. army infantry for eight months. He will devote his time at the camera shop and Baillie will be in the photo finishing service. Flo Ann Eaton remains with the firm as do others who worked for Underwood.

Anderson Favors Boost In Butter

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8 (AP)—An 18-cent a pound boost in butter prices for the housewife by April 1 was reported today to have been recommended by Secretary of Agriculture Anderson.

Aides, who could not be named, said Anderson had made the recommendation to encourage greater production. Under the plan, prices would be advanced six cents a month beginning Feb. 1.

An increase in the ceiling price Feb. 1 would be the second in less than three months. Last November, the price was increased five cents a pound to offset withdrawal of a subsidy to butter makers.
