Klamath merchants are cooperating in the American Legion sponsored Victory clothing drive in Klamath county, by offering their facilities as collection points for donations.

Don Everitt, general drive chairman announced today that these points will be the front entrance of Balsiger Motor company, Moie's store, J. C. Penney company, Sears-Roebuck, Lombard Motors and Montgomery Ward.

This week marked the end of the collection by city and county schools. The general public is asked to make donations to the drive from January 21 to 31.

Legionnaires volunteering to assist with collection pickup trucks for the school bundles are requested to report to Main and East Main this Sunday at 9 a. m.

**National Goal**

The national goal in the Victory clothing drive has been set in articles rather than poundage as in previous collections of this type. Henry Kaiser, top drive chairman stated, and the national goal is 100 million articles of clothing.

Children's wear is greatly needed, Kaiser stated, as well as warm clothing and shoes for every age. Shoes should be firmly tied in pairs by their strings or with stout twine. Straw hats, baby pillows or mattresses and toys are not desired.

# Basin Study Will Be Made

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 19 (AP)—A study of the basins of the Snake river and its tributaries, to be used in planning power and water conservation development, was announced today by Bonneville power administration and the bureau of reclamation.

Investigators, beginning work at once, will recommend a power construction program, wholesale power rates, and methods of developing the basin in conjunction with reclamation projects.

The survey, covering part of eastern Oregon, all southern Idaho, and small portions of Wyoming, Utah and Nevada, will be completed by fall. Investigators will confer with local leaders throughout the area.

# War 2 Vets Hear Talks On Surplus

More than 300 World War II veterans, interested in the purchase of surplus property and a host of other subjects, turned out Friday night to a meeting called by the Klamath veterans service committee.



Short talks were made by officials of the veterans administration, the state selective service system, the farm security administration, the bureau of reclamation, and the state department of veterans' affairs. But the hottest subject of the evening in the crowded Veterans Memorial hall was that of surplus property, and George Moscrip of the smaller war plants corporation for Oregon explained the set-up.

**Must Qualify**

Moscrip explained that a veteran desiring to purchase surplus property must first qualify through his office, and that from there on, information as to the location of the property and its eventual sale is handled through disposal agencies of the RFC.

To qualify, Moscrip explained, the veteran must show that he needs the equipment in his business, his profession, his agricultural enterprise, or as a condition of his employment. Application for purchase can be made through the local selective service board, which will handle the veteran's application form and mail it to the SWPC office in Portland, Moscrip pointed out.

**Conducts Meeting**

The meeting was conducted by Alfred D. Collier, chairman of the veterans service committee.

Other speakers included Lt. Col. George E. Sandy, Salem, chief of veterans personnel section, selective service system for Oregon, who explained the responsibilities of selective service in reinstating veterans to their pre-war jobs.

Tom Snowhill, Portland, chief of contact division for the veterans administration in Oregon, explained the rights and benefits of the GI bill pertaining to his office.

Alvin Hobart, Portland, state director for the farm security administration, outlined the loan benefits provided by the Bankhead-Jones farm loan bill as it applies to veterans. The FSA is

# Klamath County To Get Land Funds

Klamath county is scheduled to receive \$16,528.06 as its share of current payments due land grant counties in lieu of taxes on revested lands, to be made by the O. and C. revested lands administration.

Douglas county will get \$233,362.45, and Jackson will get \$158,343.02. The greatest share of O. and C. lands lie in those two counties.

None of the lands will be sold, and a sustained yield forest program has been launched there.
