

# U. S. Blamed For Unrest In Southern Korea Area

MOSCOW, Jan. 22 (AP)—The official Soviet news agency Tass today accused the United States military command in southern Korea of inspiring "reactionary" protests against the Moscow conference of foreign ministers.

In a dispatch from Hanoi, Korea, Tass assailed the "reactionary press" of southern Korea for allegedly carrying on an anti-Soviet propaganda campaign and for attacking the decl-

ation of the United States, Russia and Great Britain to set up a five-year trusteeship in Korea.

The dispatch then said: "Here the behavior of the American command in southern Korea astonishes one. It has assumed a position of inspiring reactionary demonstrations against the decisions of the Moscow conference of foreign ministers in which, as is known, the government of the United States participated."

The dispatch also attacked what it called "the counterfeit government of Kim Koo and Dr. Syngman Rhee, leaders of the unrecognized provisional government set up in exile, declaring their activity is 'directed against hampering the decisions of the Moscow conference of foreign ministers on Korea, on starting a civil war inside the country and on inflaming hostility toward the Soviet Union.'"

Tass said that on Jan. 7 in the city of Seoul representatives of the communist, peoples' national and democratic parties met to work out a joint statement on the Moscow decision, but that the "reactionary leadership" of the democratic party later repudiated the statement.

These leaders, the dispatch said, declared the representatives who signed the statement had not been authorized by the democratic party to do so, and sought to make it appear that the democratic party did not agree with the Moscow agreement.

# Heavy Snow Reported In Cascades

SALEM, Jan. 22 (AP)—Heavy snow in the Cascade mountain passes was reported today by the state highway commission.

La Grande—Two inches new snow.

Baker—Snowing lightly.

Bend—Snowing hard at La pine.

Burns—Two inches new snow, turned to rain today. Some packed snow on roads.

John Day—Still one-way traffic north of Service creek.

Austin—Snowing hard, 14 inches new snow.

# \$139 Million Requested For USBR Program

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (AP)—A \$139,000,000 reclamation bureau construction program for the fiscal year beginning July 1 was proposed in the president's budget message to congress Monday.

The total amount asked for the bureau is \$163,554,055, funds appropriated for the bureau for the 1946 fiscal year totaled only \$116,816,150.

The fiscal 1947 program contemplates construction work on more than a score of subjects, the greatest number of which were closed down during the war emergency.

Major items in the program were listed as follows:

- Columbia river basin—\$30,000,000.
- Central valley of California—\$25,000,000.
- Colorado-Big Thompson project (Colorado)—\$15,000,000.
- Davis dam (Arizona)—\$15,000,000.
- Missouri river basin—\$23,783,000.

The reclamation bureau budget includes \$11,000,000 for general investigations—a type of work for which congress appro-


