

# Nation's Timber Supply From Private Lands Said Dwindling At Rapid Rate

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—The nation's timber supply from private lands is dwindling at a rapid rate.

Chief U. S. Forester Lyle F. Watts cited these figures in his annual report on the condition of the country's forests:

Lumber cut in Pennsylvania, once the leading source of supply, has dropped to one per cent of the total for the United States.

The output of lumber in the six states, which formerly produced 8,500,000,000 board feet annually, did not get above 1,150,000,000 feet under wartime pressure.

In Virginia, lumber output has declined to one-half of the 1910 production.

"Even more revealing," said Watts, "is the mounting evidence of the extent of timber depletion in the west."

There, mills representing 60 per cent of the present sawmill capacity of Washington and Oregon do not have private timber to operate more than 15 years, he reported, adding:

"Lack of timber will inevitably force the closing of many mills in the next few years. New mill installations in southwestern Oregon, which has only been opened up to a large-scale lumbering in recent years will help sustain total output for the time being. But southwestern Oregon already has more sawmills than it can permanently support."

The Milford Victory will sail tomorrow with 1218 enlisted men and 145 officers, and the CCNY Victory leaves Saturday with 1497 enlisted men and 35 officers.

## Turtle Track Runs Nightly At Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS, Nev.—A new wagering sport—turtle racing—was introduced in Las Vegas this week.

The betting parlors, where race fans bet horses at leading tracks throughout the country by day, become paddocks and race courses for terrapin by night.

The sport was introduced by the International Footprinters, Las Vegas chapter, to raise funds for charity. Proceeds are contributed to the children's playground fund and for building a clubhouse for airplane modeling enthusiasts.

Some 200 turtles participate in 15 nightly races. Wagering is on a pari-mutuel basis.

Although the "mounts" compete with characteristic Asian lethargy, a winner is figured to cross the finish line every 15 minutes. A temperamental competitor may advance within a few inches of victory then pull a Br'r rabbit, taking time out for a nap while some more energetic rival slides on to victory.

The race course accommodates 10 entries. Each turtle is in a glass enclosed lane. Odds are posted prior to post time. Entries are named after sponsors, most of whom are Las Vegas citizens, including Nevada's members of congress, radio stars Lum 'n Abner, cowboy star Roy Rogers, and others.
