Equitable Shows Gain In Assets

An increase of \$4,303,082 in assets of the Equitable Savings and Loan association during 1945 was equal to its entire first 28 years of growth, according to E. M. Chilcote, loan representative in Klamath Falls, who received the institution's 110th semi-annual financial statement. Total assets now stand at more than \$27 million.

Funds available for mortgage investments were increased by \$2,948,405 in 1945, and the mortgage portfolio was \$17,001,570 at the end of December. Chilcote cited this increase as a great accomplishment. Loans of \$9,058,197 were made on northwest homes in 1945, more than in any other year. Since 1880 Equitable has loaned a total of \$105,850,000 on first mortgages.
