

Snows Make State Roads Hazardous

SALEM, Jan. 25 (AP)—Heavy snows, ranging up to two feet, made the Cascade mountain passes hazardous today, causing the state highway commission to advise the use of chains.

The snow depths reached the high mark for the winter, the greatest being 18 inches at Santiam summit, where 24 inches fell last night.

The Wilsonville ferry across the Willamette was closed by high water today.

The daily road report:

Santiam Junction—Packed snow on road, 30 degrees. 24 inches new snow. Total snow at summit 118 inches, at junction 66 inches. Chains advised.

Odell Lake—Snowing lightly, 19 degrees. 10 inches new snow, total snow at summit 117 inches. Chains required.

Klamath Falls—At Sun mountain, 9 inches new snow, total 104 inches, temperature 20 degrees. Packed snow on mountain, be sanded today. On Quartz mountain, 12 inches new snow, 6 degrees. On Greensprings, 9 inches new snow, 10 degrees.

Medford—70 degrees.

Astoria—Columbia River highway closed at east city limits of Astoria, detouring through Tongue Point naval base. Oregon Coast highway, one-way traffic near Manzanita.

Mencliam—Some ice on Old Oregon Trail, 31 inches total snow.

Baker—Some ice on pavement.

Chemult—Seven inches new snow, total 50 inches. The Dallas-Columbia highway quite slick.

Lapine—Seven inches new snow, packed snow on road.

Bend—Light packed snow on road.

John Day—One-half inch new snow.

Austin—Snowing lightly, 4 inches new snow.

Snell Sells Auto Agency

ARLINGTON, Jan. 25 (AP)—Governor Snell and D. L. Lemon have sold their garage and automobile sales agency here to Jodie K. Morrison, A. C. Smythe and Roy Wheelhouse.

The sale marks the end of a 30-year partnership for the pair, who at one time operated three automobile agencies and an oil distributing plant here.

In Salem, the governor said that sale of his business has nothing to do with his political plans. He was noncommittal on whether he would seek reelection this year.

Trial opened in circuit court here yesterday, but jury selection is expected to take two days. Crenshaw, alias Harold Wayne Hollister, was arrested in Spokane a few weeks after the killing.
