

One Killed, Six Wounded In Argentine Disorders

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 26 (AP)—Tension increased today in Argentina's presidential campaign as the result of a series of gun battles between communists and supporters of Col. Juan Peron, a laborite candidate, in which one person was killed and six wounded last night.

The shooting started when the Peron supporters, who had just been to a Buenos Aires railway station to see the former vice president off on a campaign tour, encountered a communist sound truck and a car of guards.

Later the Peron group marched toward the center of the city where further shooting took place.

This was the second outbreak of violence in 48 hours. A boy was killed and a woman wounded Tuesday night when a band of men and boys fired on the campaign train. The Argentine anti-Peron candidate of the democratic union.

The Peronists attacked and two attacks earlier in the day. Interior Minister Juan Peron ordered a military train to join Tamborini's special train.

A heavy police guard also was ordered to cover the route from the railway station in Plaza Uman to independence plaza, where Tamborini and his running mate, Dr. Enrique M. Mosca, held a major rally last night.

A few hours before the rally police broke up a series of street fights between Peronist and anti-Peronist supporters of Tamborini and Peron.

Meaning a dispute between two political groups backing Peron was settled when the labor party agreed to accept Hortensio Quijano, former minister of the interior, as vice presidential candidate.

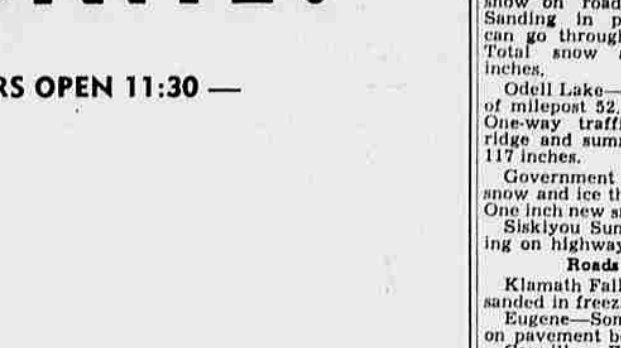

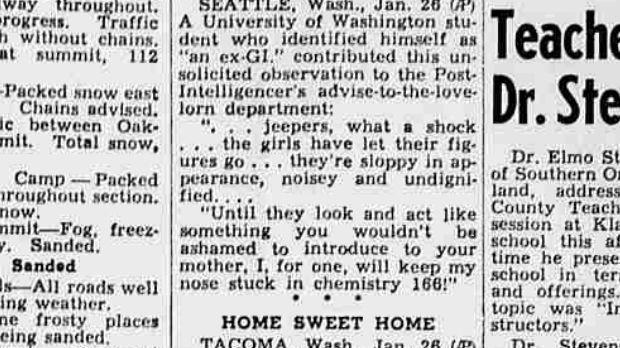

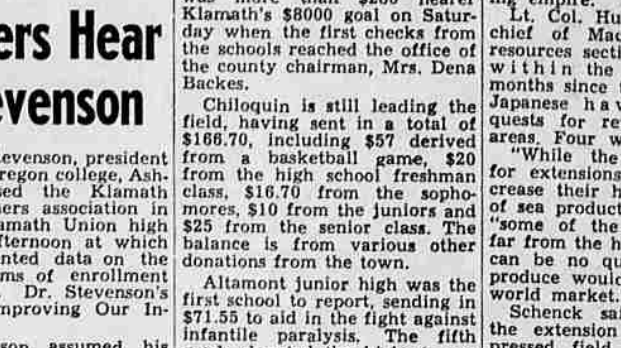
