Six Men Pay Heavy Fines For Deer Meat Possession

Six Klamath men were arrested yesterday and paid heavy fines in justice court for illegal possession of venison. They were caught with the dressed carcasses of six does, five of them fresh.

Leo Elvin Friend Sr., and William Thomas Myers, an employee of Friend, both pleaded guilty to having the venison in their possession and were fined \$150 and \$7.20 costs yesterday afternoon.

Both denied having shot the animals. Later Leo Elvin Friend Jr., John Nelson Friend, Elmer Nathaniel Carlson and Edward Thomas Bentley pleaded guilty to the same charge and each was fined \$150 and costs.

The deer were killed in the California lava beds winter grazing area. Yesterday the California state police found the place where they had been slaughtered and trailed the car bearing the venison and hides back to the state line.

They gave the auto license number to the local state police and Monday morning a state officer went to Friend's house and found the five freshly skinned and cleaned carcasses, one other carcass which apparently had been killed about two weeks ago and the hides.

The dressed carcasses were fat and in good condition—a mute denial of the contention that deer are starving on the California winter range.

By justice court order the meat was confiscated and given to the county poor farm.

None of the men was accused of killing the deer, the charge being only possession of venison out of season, but there was some discussion as to whether the last four men brought into court should be returned to California to face charges of the illegal hunting.

Gale Bishop Pilots Cougars To Victory

Holdout Parade In Big Leagues Forming Fast

NEW YORK, Feb. 5 (P)—Whitely Kurovski, the St. Louis Cardinals' solid thumping third baseman, and Speedy Luis Olmo of the Brooklyn Dodgers are the latest players to join the big league holdout brigade.

Kurovski, who was the National league's fifth ranking batter and his club's leading belter with a .323 average last season, shot back his unsigned contract to Owner Sam Breadon yesterday, remarking that the terms were anything but satisfactory.

It had been rumored ever since the last diamond campaign ended that the blond, 190-pound infielder was ticketed for the Philadelphia Phils and it is known in baseball circles that he is one of a group of Redbird stars who would like to do their ball playing in different uniforms.

Olmo, who rapped out a fancy .313 average for 1945 and handled himself ably in centerfield, announced in Puerto Rico that he was dissatisfied with the terms Brooklyn offered.

The Veteran Dixie Walker, who played alongside of Olmo in the Dodger picket line, also is unhappy over the contract mailed out by Brooklyn's Prexy Branch Rickey, it has been learned.
