

Icy Streets Cause Wrecks

The snow-covered, icy streets have brought city police a bumper crop of minor accident reports, but only one person, a small boy, has been injured in any of Thursday's mishaps.

Paul George Juveland, 7-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul W. Juveland, 1835 Manzanita, was struck by a car driven by A. L. Fitzwater, 2237 Oregon, while coasting on a sled down Portland yesterday afternoon.

Fitzwater reported that he was driving on Pacific Terrace when the sled came down Portland and passed right in the path of his car at the intersection. The boy was only slightly injured and was returned home where he received medical attention.

The greatest damage to vehicles resulting from any of yesterday's accidents was caused to cars operated by Leonard Michelson, 228 No. 4th, and Charles H. Stewart, 1110 Main, which crashed at Main and 6th last night.

Michelson estimated the damage to his 1941 Ford at \$100 and to Stewart's 1938 Chevrolet at \$85.

S. F. Or London Pushed As Site

LONDON, Feb. 8 (AP)—A highly responsible source said tonight a trend was developing to locate the United Nations temporary headquarters in San Francisco or London, rather than in New York, and to delay the decision on the permanent site a year or two.

The site-inspection committee recommended New York City for the provisional seat and an area on the New York-Connecticut border for permanent headquarters.

Foley Case Continued

Foley was indicted by the grand jury December 20 in connection with the death of Johnnie Spicher following an automobile accident on S. 8th on November 24.

He has entered a plea of not guilty and is free on \$5000 bond.
