PORTLAND, Feb. 8 (AP)—Floyd K. Dover, Grants Pass, mentioned as a possible democratic gubernatorial candidate, criticized Governor Snell in a speech here last night for what he called "lack of leadership."

He declared the governor should have asked aid from representatives of business, labor and veterans to prevent unemployment. Dover said Oregon's republican administration has not solved veterans' housing and job problems.

"For four years," he stated, "you've heard that Oregon veterans are not going to come back without homes and without jobs. Now they're coming back and they are without homes and without jobs." Dover was addressing the Willamette Democratic society.

Housewives Rush To Purchase Flour

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 8 (AP)—Moderate flour stocks on retail shelves melted today as housewives, alarmed by President Truman's order for mills to conserve wheat, rushed to buy all they could carry.

One chain store spokesman, however, predicted weevils would spoil hoarders' supplies. And B. R. Pooley, Crown Mills sales manager, said no flour shortage would result if wheat continued to move from grower areas.

The boxcar shortage already had prompted millers to carefully dole out stocks to dealers.
