

# Price Controls On Present Houses Stricken From Homes-For-Veterans Bill; Floor Fight Looms In House

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12 (AP)—Despite the pleas of Housing Boss Wilson W. Wyatt, the homes-for-veterans bill will go to the house floor next week minus the price ceilings President Truman wants on old houses.

A fight on party lines is probable on that issue, but Wyatt last night got republican and democratic leaders to agree to another key portion of Mr. Truman's two-year program for 2,700,000 new homes.

This calls for \$600,000,000 worth of federal subsidies—Wyatt calls them "premium payments"—to stimulate the output of scarce building materials.

## 17-Year-Olds Join Navy

Seventeen-year-olds, wise to advantages of the GI bill of rights as revised January 12, 1946, number 50 per cent of navy enlistments. Vernon Chilwood, officer in charge of the local navy recruiting office, stated today.

Klamath basin men who have enlisted since February 1, are Jack Russell Fossum, Calvin Harold Dobbins, Lester Ivan Thompson, Klamath Falls; Donald Rayford Horne, Bly; Robert George Rogers, Beatty; Boyde Dwight Oliver, Malin; Merie Merritt Nelson, Summer Lake.

These men and all those enlisting until the end of the duration of emergency will be entitled to advantages of the revised bill of rights including raised maximum farm and home loans; extended time limits for obtaining government loans; raised subsistence allowances for single veterans as well as those with families, in the educational provisions.

Disabled veterans going to school will get a minimum of \$105 per month subsistence. The 25-year age limit is eliminated, veterans may take correspondence courses at government expense and may start school from two to four years after the war.

An honorable discharge from the navy is the key to these mentioned advantages as well as numerous others, Chilwood explained.

## Firemen Douse Hotel Blaze

SEATTLE, Feb. 12 (AP)—Possible loss of many lives was averted yesterday when a downtown hotel caught fire while a fire crew was making a routine inspection of the building. One man was burned critically.

Fire Chief William Fitzgerald said "If the fire had started last night 15 or 20 lives would have been lost."

James McLaughlin, 45, found burned and overcome by smoke in his second floor room, was carried down a ladder to safety. His condition remained critical today. Seven other men and the manager, W. W. Clair, 89, were helped down ladders. Among the former was L. C. Gibson, 35, Centralia, who escaped with only a quilt clutched around his body.

The interior of the hotel was an inferno in a matter of minutes. One man, L. C. Wilson, a 250-pound cook, fled nude to a window, where he was rescued by firemen on a ladder.
