

Men To Be Hired For Work On Ships

PORTLAND, Feb. 12 (P) — The maritime commission will begin hiring workers this week on a modest scale in connection with layup work for surplus vessels to be berthed here, Capt. E. E. Thorne reported today.

He said about 30 men will be needed to start, but at the peak of berthing and maintenance about 400 men will be necessary.
