

U. S. Charges Nazis Have Built In Argentina Replica Of Economic War Machine That Was Used In Germany

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13 (AP)—In a warning to the world Tuesday the United States charged that Nazis have built in Argentina a complete copy of the economic war machine they had in Germany and now possess the essentials for reorganizing their fighting power while the allies occupy the German homeland.

The warning was set forth in a 40,000 word "blue book" on Argentina distributed to the other American governments as part of the current inter-American consultations on the Buenos Aires regime.

State department officials in making it public said Argentina was not included in these inter-government talks.

Aided Nazis

Based largely on nazi documents captured in a German salt mine, the department denounced the successive Argentine governments for having given "positive aid" to the axis during the war.

The department said the evidence justified conclusions that:

1. The totalitarian individuals and groups controlling the Argentine government now aim to set up a totalitarian state and that this is already "partly accomplished."

2. Its "brutal use of force and terrorist methods . . . the military regime has made a mockery of its pledges to the United Nations" to reaffirm faith in human rights.

3. Ever since the allies invaded Europe, Argentina had been adopting a "defensive strategy to camouflage" and that its "repeated avowals of pro-democratic intentions" proceed from this plan.

4. The policies and actions of the recent regimes in Argentina were aimed at undermining the inter-American system.

Noting that over half of last year's budget in Argentina was spent for building up Argentina's armed forces, the department declared that "in Argentina the Germans have constructed a complete duplicate of the economic structure for war they had in Germany."

Economic Organization

"They possess," he continued, "today in Argentina the economic organization—industrial, commercial and agricultural—which they need to provide a base for the reconstitution of German aggressive power during the period when the homeland is still occupied."

"The industries essential to warfare in which experimentation in the weapons of future wars may take place and in which prototypes may be developed exist in Argentina and are controlled by Germans."

The department further said that businesses which can be relied upon "to provide reserves for future aggression in countries destined for conquest, continue to exist."

The state department listed 21 of what it called the "more notorious" spies and subversive agents in Argentina and the German firms with which they are associated.

It also reviewed in detail the manner in which it contends the government has taken over control of the labor unions, suppressed opposition by "brutal use of force and terrorist methods," and subsidized a pro-nazi press to keep the nazi ideology alive.

Frequently mentioning the part played by Col. Juan Peron, former vice president and currently presidential candidate, the department noted that Peron as minister of labor in 1944 brought all labor unions under government control "into one giant syndicate or state union."

"Since 1943 no Argentine union has had a free election," he declared.

The "blue book" also charged that Argentina has protected German businesses and interests along with nazi individuals.

Salem Wants Rent Control

SALEM, Feb. 13 (AP)—The Salem trades and labor council and the newly-organized World War II post of the American Legion appealed to the OPA last night to establish rent ceilings in Salem.

Salem had rent control by city ordinance, but it expired last November 15. Since then, rents have skyrocketed. The Salem Capital Journal, which is conducting a rent-reducing campaign, quoted federal housing authority heads as saying that Salem rents are the highest in Oregon.

City officials warned that unless landlords cut rents, they will go back to local control. Both the labor and veterans group, however, oppose local control, asserting federal control is more effective and that it also could apply outside the city limits.

The veterans resolution said that returning veterans "are dismayed and angered to discover that their return and readjustment to civilian life is being deliberately thrown out of gear by unscrupulous landlords with short memories."

Eleven hundred men leave on the SS Cape Henloper today and 1900 more sail on the Sea Quail next Monday.

"As a result of all these developments the Argentina dictatorship which emerged after June 1943 represents a closely-woven union of both Argentine and German or German inspired totalitarian elements."

Two hundred schools in Argentina are either nazi controlled or strongly influenced by the Germans, it said.

OPA's Goal Six Pairs Of Nylons For Every Woman

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13 (AP)—Six pairs of nylons by next July for every woman in the country is OPA's goal.

"The trade feels it will be perhaps July before every woman has perhaps half a dozen pairs put away," Deputy Price Administrator Geoffrey Baker told the house appropriations committee during consideration of an OPA supply bill approved today.

Baker said the principal shortage now is due to lack of certain shaping machines. Once these machines are ready, he said, there will be adequate nylon yarn for a plentiful supply of hose by early summer.

Airbase Will Be Abandoned

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 13 (AP)—Early army abandonment of the Portland army airbase was reported here by Col. E. B. Bayley, but the commandant said today he has not received formal notice of the action.

He said about half the 1500 officers and men stationed at the base will be discharged by March and the others will be eligible for discharges soon afterward. Civilian employes now total about 200 from a wartime peak of 1000.

Civilian planes equipped with two-way radio have been using the base for several months.

WALDPOR, Feb. 13 (AP)—Recovery of the body of Walter Estes Blackstock, 37, Newport, from Howells lake north of here was reported today by State Police Sgt. W. J. Mulkey.

State Road Conditions Improved

SALEM, Feb. 13 (AP)—Oregon highway conditions were generally improved today, with snow and ice cleared from the Old Oregon Trail and the Siskiyou summit on the Pacific highway, the state highway commission said today.

Chains were still recommended for the passes on the Santiam and Willamette highways, while the commission expects to reopen tomorrow the Columbia River highway, which was closed last week by a slide near Multnomah Falls. A bridge is being built across the section of highway that was dug out by the slide.

The road report also said: Government Camp—High fog, 28 degrees, 105 inches total snow, packed snow and ice throughout district. Well sanded.

Santiam Junction—20 degrees, overcast, packed snow on road is being sanded. Total snow at summit 156 inches, at junction 91 inches, chains advised.

Odell Lake—Light overcast, 17 degrees, 160 inches of snow at summit, packed snow east of MetCredle Springs, chains advised. Three short sections of one-way traffic above Oakridge because of washouts.

Use Of Hooch Hits New High

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13 (AP)—Liquor consumption in the United States during 1945 was the greatest in history—around 165,000,000 gallons, treasury figures showed today.

On a per capita basis, consumption hit the highest mark since prohibition was repealed 13 years ago. The 1945 figure was 1.38 gallons per person, against 1.66 gallons in 1917, when the population was less, hence the total consumption was smaller.

Last year's sharp upturn followed two years of decline. Per capita consumption fell from 1.15 gallons in 1942 to 1.13 in 1943, and to 0.98 in 1944.

192 Survivors Of Yukon Due

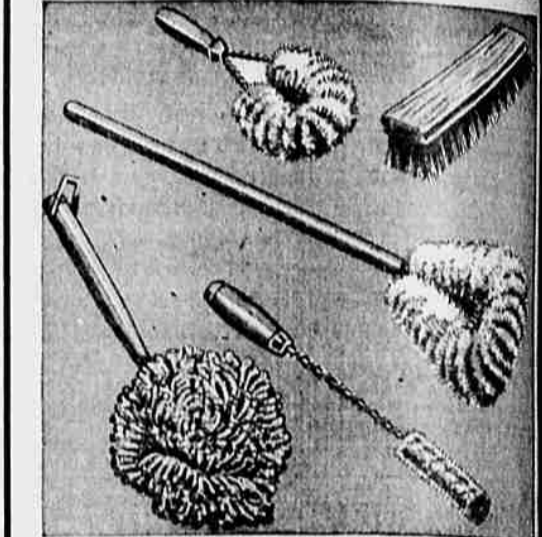
SEATTLE, Feb. 13 (AP)—Due here today, the SS Alaska is bringing 192 survivors of the wrecked liner Yukon. The SS Benali is on the way from Seward with 16 more. And seven of the shipwrecked persons arrived

at Boeing field via Pan American plane last night.

When the Alaska arrived at Seattle the coast guard bureau of marine inspection to open hearings on the Yukon loss.

Ten persons are still accounted for and one body has been recovered from the wreck of the vessel which ran aground in Johnstone bay last August night seven hours after leaving Seward.
