

13 Highway Workers To Be Honored

SALEM, Feb. 14 (AP)—Thirteen high-ranking Oregon highway commission employees will be honored by the American Association of State Highway Officials for having more than 25 years of service with the commission, State Highway Engineer R. H. Baldoock said today.




