

Cold Wave Moves Down From Canada

A cold wave expected to drive the mercury as low as 30 below zero in Minnesota by tomorrow morning moved down from Canada today in the wake of a storm which left heavy snow in at least three midwestern states.

Chicago forecasters in a special warning of the cold wave predicted minimums by tomorrow would be 20 to 30 below in Minnesota, zero to 20 below in Iowa, 5 to 20 below in Wisconsin, 12 below to 15 below in Illinois, 10 below to 10 above in Indiana and 2 below to 10 above in Michigan.

Chicago, where traffic was impeded last night by the winter's heaviest snow, 3.6 inches drifted by strong winds, prepared for 5 below weather by tomorrow with 25 mile-an-hour northerly winds. There were numerous accidents including one in which 20 persons were slightly injured when a bus skidded over a curb.

Heavy Snow
Householders had to get out the shovels before they could move automobiles parked outdoors in Chicago. The street car and bus companies had more than 200 snow plows at work.

The Chicago weather bureau said snow ranging from 3 to 5 inches fell and drifted in northern Missouri, northern Illinois and lower Michigan, with lesser amounts in Ohio and Indiana and isolated precipitation in Kansas, Colorado and Oklahoma. Kansas City had 3 inches and St. Louis 5 inches.

The storm moved on northward and was beyond Lake Huron today. As it passed the temperature dropped steadily in northern border states, with early morning minimums of 17 below reported at Pembina, N. D., 14 below at Devil's Lake, N. D., and 7 below at Bemidji, Minn.

Bureau Will Add To Force

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14 (AP)—The reclamation bureau plans to add 7690 employees to its field force by June 30, 1947, to handle an expanded construction program, it was learned today.

Officials of the department told a reporter funds have already been authorized and 6124 new employees will be hired by June 30 of this year. Another 1566 will be added in the next year if congress approved a recommended construction program.

These increases are scheduled: Region No. 1, Washington, Oregon, Idaho and western Montana, headquarters at Boise, Idaho, 709 by June 30, 1946, and 950 by June 30, 1947.
