

Mat Fan Arrested After Fray

Cecil Lukes, Klamath Falls, posted \$15 bail with city police last night for disorderly conduct after he was hustled from the armory wrestling matches for disputing one of Referee Wiley Moss' decisions.

The incident occurred during the semi-final bout between Bob Keneston and Steve Petroff. Moss awarded the fight to Keneston and then was pursued to the dressing room by Petroff. Lukes, a spectator, also did not like the decision and joined in the fray until police nabbed him.

City police traffic detail was active last night, making numerous arrests for traffic violations and towing in several improperly parked cars from Main street.

Russia Backs Levant States

LONDON, Feb. 15 (AP)—Russia threw her support to the Levant states in the United Nations security council today, declaring their sovereignty had been "clearly violated" by the occupation of British and French troops.

Vice Commissar Andrei Vishinsky told the council a French proposal to permit Britain and France to work out an agreement on withdrawal of their forces from Syria and Lebanon "cannot satisfy the Soviet union."

Vishinsky spoke after the United States had suggested that the Levant states settle their complaint by direct negotiations. (See Also Page 8)

Navy Pilot Found By Logging Crew

SEATTLE, Feb. 15 (AP)—Rescued five days after crashing in the snowy wilderness near Mount Rainier, Wayman M. Todd, Abilene, Tex., 24-year-old navy student pilot found by a logging crew, was in a serious condition today suffering serious frostbite of both legs.

He was found near a logging railroad yesterday noon, semi-conscious and unable to talk within 400 feet of a well-stocked cabin. He had been missing since Saturday when he left Boeing field here on a flight to North Bend, Ore., in a small rented plane.

Tito Will Prevent Further 'Incidents'

BELGRADE, Feb. 15 (AP)—Marshall Tito has assured U. S. Ambassador Richard C. Patterson Jr., that he will take immediate action to prevent repetition of Monday's incident when Yugoslav militiamen broke into and seized U. S. vehicles in the embassy parking lot.

William Fraleigh, embassy second secretary, who delivered the ambassador's note of protest to Marshal Tito yesterday, said he had received the assurances informally. A formal reply was expected later.

Bus Driver Loses Operator's License

PORTLAND, Feb. 15 (AP)—A bus driver whose bus swerved to a street car while according to testimony in municipal court—he argued with a passenger about a transfer, had lost his driver's license today.

The accident injured 27 persons. The driver, Harold R. Stanton, 43, was fined \$250 and given a 30-day suspended sentence. His driver's license was revoked for a year.

Alaska Cheers Exit Of Ickes

JUNEAU, Alaska, Feb. 15 (AP)—Alaskans are quite happy about Mr. Ickes' resignation.

"Alaska has suffered under Ickes' iron rule for 13 years," the Juneau Empire said yesterday. "There is hope that a man from the western states who may have a more sympathetic attitude toward Alaska will succeed Ickes."

Mayor R. C. Pederson of Ketchikan, said "Alaskans certainly are shedding no tears," and added he thought it was "excellent for the future of Alaska."

Driver Nabbed In Wild Chase

PORTLAND, Feb. 15 (AP)—The driver of a stolen car crashed into several parked cars, knocked down a parking meter and struck a pedestrian today in a flight from three police cars.

The bullet-punctured chase started when the youthful driver raced off as police attempted to halt him for questioning. The car struck a soldier, Morris W. Gessman, Portland, breaking his arm.

Police, firing at the car, finally sent it skidding into a building. The driver was arrested as he ran into a neighboring warehouse.

SINGAPORE, Feb. 15 (AP)—One Chinese was killed and 17 wounded today when police dispersed a crowd of about 100 persons who ignored a police order forbidding the communist party to hold a rally on the fourth anniversary of the fall of Singapore to the Japanese.

The headquarters of Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten immediately announced that it would investigate allegations that members of the civilian police force had charged into the crowd with batons and loaded rifles.

Yank Guilty Of Cruelty Charge

LONDON, Feb. 15 (AP)—Sgt. Hudson H. Smith of Cumberland, Ky., first of 12 defendants to be tried on charges of cruelty to American army personnel at Lichfield prison camp, was found guilty by a United States court-martial today.

The court sentenced the 33-year-old former coal miner to dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances and three years at hard labor.

SEATTLE, Feb. 15 (AP)—Preparing to strike Monday, shutting down 79 Washington and Oregon plants, some 3000 Pacific northwest members of the Foundry Workers and Molders union (AFL) voted to reject a management proposal for settlement of their wage demands, Neil V. Pardo said for the union last night.

General Smith Russian Envoy

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15 (AP)—President Truman turned today to his favorite school of diplomacy—the military—to fill one of this country's toughest foreign posts. He named Lt. Gen. Walter Bedell Smith as ambassador to Russia.

The tart-tongued 51-year-old soldier who rose through the ranks to become General Eisenhower's chief of staff in the tense war years, will succeed dapper, wealthy, W. Averell Harriman.

Less than 12 hours after he reached Washington from a diplomatic mission to the East, Harriman gained presidential acceptance of a resignation he first submitted last April in order to return to private business.
