

440 Repats Will Sail For Japan

TULELAKE, Feb. 19—Department of justice is moving approximately 440 voluntary Japanese repatriates from here by special train today to San Pedro, from where they will sail Thursday for Japan.

The group, most of them members of families, will be in charge of Ivan Williams, head of the border patrol at Newell. The repatriates have been instructed to be at the department of justice processing station at 1 p. m., and the train was scheduled to leave at 4.

Persons notified of recommendation for removal to Japan as a result of recent department of justice hearings and who have not requested voluntary repatriation, will be removed in the near future to a department of justice internment camp. It is tentatively planned.

Sixty persons eligible for relocation will leave here also today and the project population will be reduced to 4200 by tonight.

An increase in those eligible to be relocated is expected by next week, when 100 persons a day will move out. WRA services are being sharply curtailed and entire blocks of the camp are being closed. The hospital remains open.

Clemens Returns To School Faculty

Jerry Clemens is again instructing the science class at Fremont junior high school after an absence of two years in the armed forces. Clemens took over the class Monday morning.

Mrs. James Scott, who has been teaching science during Clemens' absence, has retired to devote her time to her home.

Clemens served in the battles of Leyte and Okinawa and was on Mindoro after W. J. Dan until his return to the United States. He received his honorable discharge about a week ago.
