Oregon Road Report Issued By Commission

SALEM, Feb. 20 (AP)—The state highway commission issued the following road report today: Santiam Junction—Broken overcast, 28 degrees, 1 inch snow. Packed snow and ice on road, chains advised. Total snow at summit 139 inches, at junction 73 inches.

Odell Lake—Overcast, 27 degrees, 144 inches snow at summit. Light snow fell last night. Three short sections of one-way traffic above Oakridge because of washouts.

Siskiyou Summit—Packed snow from 3 miles north of summit to state line. Road well sanded.

Sun mountain, The Dalles-California highway—22 degrees, cloudy, 116 inches total snow, trace of snow fell last night. Road being sanded.

Green Springs Highway—22 degrees, road frosty but sanded.

Quartz mountain, Klamath-Lakeview highway—27 degrees, trace of snow last night.

Roseburg—Foggy.
Astoria—Lower Columbia highway still closed at east city limits of Astoria by slide, detouring through Tongue point naval base. Oregon coast highway still closed by slide north of Manzanita, detouring via Sungei and Necanicum highways.

Still one-way traffic on short section of Mist-Clellan highway because of washout.

Meacham—Light snow, roads quite icy.

Austin—Snowing lightly. A half inch of new snow.

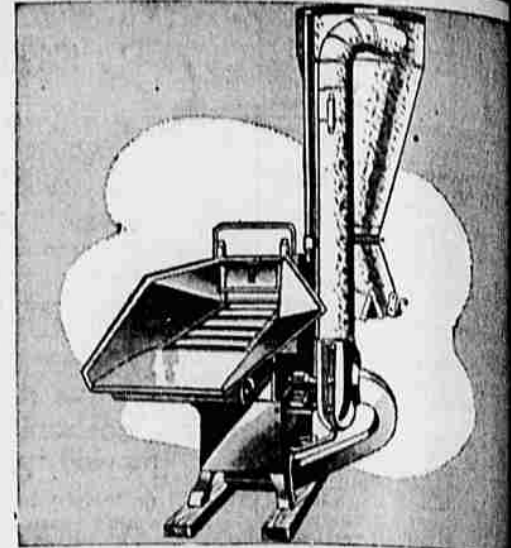
