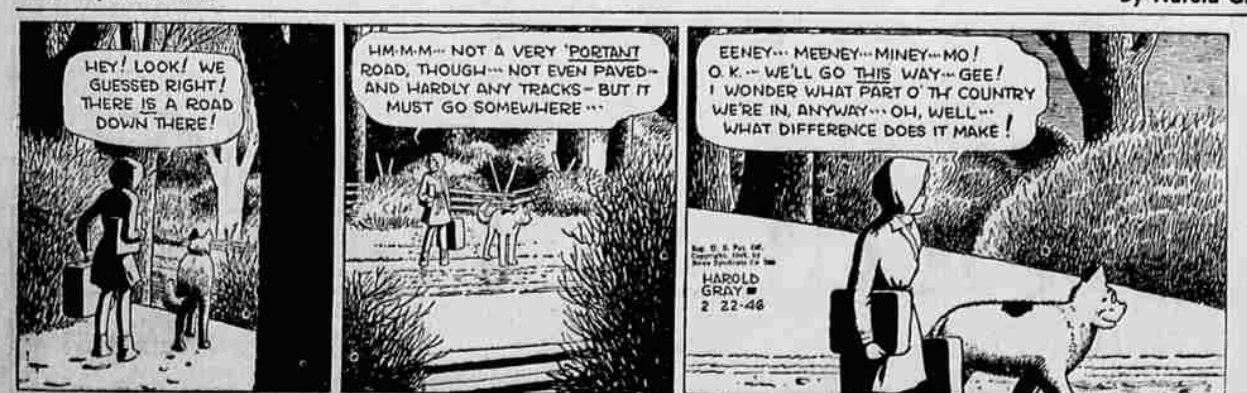

ALTURAS, Calif., Feb. 22-- At a meeting of the Modoc County National Farm Loan association held here this week and attended by 152 members, Bayley Dorris of Alturas, was elected as president.

Dividends in the amount of \$1700 are to be paid to the stock holders. A. H. Burmister, Alturas, was elected to serve three years as a director of the association.

A luncheon was served the members at the Niles hotel after which A. J. Shields, secretary of the Federal Land bank of Berkeley, L. A. Taylor of the production credit association and Marshall Swearingen, area representative for the California farm bureau, gave short talks.
