WHEAT

CHICAGO, Feb. 27 (AP)—The price of May wheat held steady to firm, most of the time today, despite another 5 cent limit break in the grain at Winnipeg.

The Canadian market slipped another nickel daily limit off both the May and July deliveries again at the start of trading, extending the recession there to 30 cents in the six days since the exchange boosted the margin requirements from 50 cents to \$1.00 a bushel on those contracts.

Fluctuations here were slow and narrow for the most part, while oats coated along at barely steady prices.

Wheat, corn and barley closed again at ceiling prices of \$1.04, \$1.18 and \$1.22, respectively, unchanged from the previous day.

Oats were unchanged to 1/4 cent higher, at \$1.14, while rye dipped in the final hours of trading and finished 1 1/2-2 1/2 lower, at \$2.14-1/2.

Other contracts remained at \$1.44-1/2, unchanged.

CHICAGO, Feb. 27 (AP)—USDA—Salable cattle 125, total 325; salable cattle 25, total 55; market steady on all offerings; run mostly dairy cows selling freely from \$7.50-11.50; few beef cows up to \$12.50; only one carried good grade steers, these steady at \$16.50; few cut-outs at \$15.00; all other offerings in truck-in market; few common, medium steers and heifers \$11.00-14.50; bull supply limited, most offerings \$10.50-12.50; vealers steady to \$15.50.

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
