

Snow Heavy At Crater Lake

MEDFORD, Feb. 28 (AP)—The third heaviest snow at Crater Lake park headquarters since 1930 was reported by the park office today after a survey.

The fall had an unusually heavy water content: 68.4 inches out of a total snowcover of 155.4 inches. This compares with 32 and 92.4 inches at the same time last year.

Snow depth at the Annie Springs entrance measured 148.3, with 63.1 inches of water content, compared to last year's 72 and 24.2.

The crew which traveled into the region by snow-cat reported the lake "calm and beautiful" with no signs of a volcanic cloud. The lake rim was banked by 15 feet 8 inches of snow.
