

S. Showdown With Moscow Over Red Army's Deployment Foreshadowed By Byrnes' Talk On New Foreign Policy

WASHINGTON, March 1 (AP)—American showdown with Moscow over the red army's deployment in strategic areas of Europe and Asia was foretold today by the stern foreign policy enunciated by Secretary of State Byrnes. Direct and vigorous measures were indicated against Soviet policy of stripping territory from liberated countries of former enemy satellite nations.

Byrnes announcement in New York last night was generally interpreted here as heralding a tougher administration toward Russia all along the line, particularly with reference to Soviet expansionist tendencies and the Kremlin's lone-dog maneuverings in neighboring nations.

Removal issues seemed like a figure in the Soviet troop removal issue, according to information here. They are Iran, Iraq and China, but there are other areas less urgently considered.

Efforts have been underway some time, it was learned, to get the Russians to agree to withdrawal of allied troops from Austria—but without success.

Tomorrow is the generally accepted deadline for evacuation of Soviet forces from Iran, the time Byrnes spoke, there was no official indication that the Russians would get out by then.

However, Iranian Undersecretary of State Firouz announced in Tehran today that the troops had received orders to begin leaving tomorrow, while there is growing concern among many officials in Soviet intentions in Manchuria in view of recent reports that red army forces there show signs of staying on indefinitely.

The Manchurian situation is considered by many authorities to be critical at the moment, but private comment here is that Byrnes' warning "we do not want to stumble and stagger into a situation where no power intends war, no power will be able to win."

Main Points
The main points of the speech by diplomatic officials are as follows:
1. The development of a more serious American leadership in world affairs.
2. The United States intends to live up fully to the principles of the United Nations charter and to use all its influence to see that other nations do the same.
3. To that end the United States must be mightily armed at such time as reduction of armaments along all the power-nations becomes possible.
4. Disarming alone, Byrnes said, the United States would lose its position and upset the power balance of the world, endangering peace.
5. The United States believes no nation has a right to its troops in an independent country unless that country wants them there. It also says that troops should be withdrawn as quickly as possible from "small and impoverished states"—presumably meaning the ex-enemy satellite states of eastern Europe.
6. There is no danger of war as each nation lives up to the obligations of the United Nations charter not to employ force except to prevent aggression. When any other country uses force or the threat of force in violation of the charter, "we cannot stand aloof," Byrnes said.

Special Confab
The big powers may hold special conferences among themselves to solve their own problems. This statement by the secretary was interpreted by persons here as designed to open the way again for more frequent meetings if President Truman, Premier Stalin or some Minister Attlee think they would do any good.
7. No nation has the right to "help itself" to property in conquered or liberated territory.
