Seeks Re-Election

Contests Sure For 2 Offices

Races for two more of Klamath county's political offices appeared a certainty today with the filing of Frank Z. Howard for renomination as county surveyor and announcement that Ernest William (Bill) Massey will seek the democratic nomination for commissioner.

Howard is now ending his second four-year term as surveyor. Wally Hector, present county engineer, filed an application for the surveyor nomination three weeks ago. Hector is also a republican and there has been no democratic candidate put up for that job.

Massey is a relative newcomer to Klamath Falls, coming here from Portland over a year ago as district circulation man for the Oregon Journal.

His candidacy was announced this morning by Pat Ivory, county democratic chairman. Massey will run against Fred Pope, incumbent commissioner, who announced for the renomination as a republican several weeks ago. Pope, resident of Fort Klamath, is ending his first term in office.

Massey, 43, is a veteran of World War I, and an active

worker in the American Legion and the Eagles. His statement of policy today announced that, if elected commissioner, he would give the county keen business administration, paying particular attention to the development of roads with an eye toward development of tourist trade.

Another democratic candidate, W. Lamar Townsend, who has announced intention of seeking the nomination for congressman of the Oregon second district, left today for Salem where he will file with the secretary of state in person, then visit democratic leaders in the second district.

Townsend will oppose Lowell Stockman of Pendleton, who is seeking reelection on the republican ticket.

Salem Council Against Manager

SALEM, March 5 (AP)—The proposal for a city manager form of government for Salem was defeated last night by the city council, which voted 7 to 5 against placing the city manager charter amendment on the May 17 primary election ballot.

Sponsors of the plan, including Mayor I. M. Doughton, are expected to ask the council to reconsider the vote. The voters rejected a similar plan two years ago.

WASHINGTON, March 5 (AP)—Former President Herbert Hoover today accepted an invitation by President Truman to go to Europe to survey food needs of that continent.

Mr. Hoover's acceptance was announced by Secretary of Agriculture Anderson following a breakfast discussion of the food situation, attended by the former chief executive, who carried out foreign relief programs in Europe after World War I.

Anderson said Mr. Hoover will leave probably next week for the food survey which may require 30 days to complete.
