The World Today

BERN, Switzerland, March 5 Letters are arriving from readers who are anxious to tour Europe and want advice on how to go about it.

That's a project for which your globe trotting columnist team has a sympathetic understanding. We have the same urge and it grows stronger as we proceed on the great adventure of watching the rebirth of a continent...

However, the very fact that this is one of the great changes of the ages, and that it is being staged in the midst of unprecedented destruction, is fair warning that observers must expect to encounter many difficulties and hardships...

There are European countries which are looking forward eagerly to a renewal of tourist trade. Among them is Switzerland, which is making special plans to accommodate visitors. But there are many others which are too badly hurt to be able to deal with any great influx of tourists...

Therefore, our advice to would-be tourists is to consult the consulates or embassies of the countries which they wish to visit to determine whether it's a suitable time. In most cases you probably will be advised not to undertake the trip before warm weather arrives, even if a welcome is held out after that time.

One important item to remember is that touring in Europe is devilishly expensive. Don't start out with the idea that you can do it cheaply and still have adequate food and lodging. The reason, of course, is that there is a great shortage of food and housing in most countries...

Naturally the objective of most visitors—the devastated area of Germany—is unattainable at present by the average traveler. There is neither food nor shelter to spare, though the conquered territories presumably will be opened up in due course.

Tribute Paid To J. H. Dalen

LAKEVIEW, March 5—Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at the Elks lodge rooms for J. H. Dalen, Lakeview lumberman and civic leader, who died last Thursday following a heart attack...

Mr. Dalen was born near North Platte, Neb., on January 11, 1886. He became interested in the lumber business at the age of 15, and when the United States entered the first World war, he signed up as a pilot with the naval air corps...

His first mill operation was at Bandon, Ore., and prior to coming to Lakeview he operated mills at Myrtle Point, Coquille, Grants Pass and at Hoquiam, Wash. He came to Lakeview from Grants Pass in the fall of 1939. The Oregon Moulding and Lumber company plant in Lakeview was established on the basis of his previous experience.

Mr. Dalen was a member of the Masonic and Shrine lodges, the Elks, American Legion, Rotary club and Lake county chamber of commerce. He was a past president of the Rotary club, vice president of the Lake County chamber of commerce and chairman of the aviation committee...

Vets Priority Rules Changed

Amended orders concerning veterans preference certificates for new farm machinery allow dealers a choice as to filling a veterans' order. The dealer may now fill the order from machinery on the floor at the time the certificate is presented or he may elect to fill the order from the first item of such equipment received by him.

The amended war food administration order-135 also provides expiration dates for veterans preference certificates. These certificates now become void if (1) not presented to a dealer within 15 days from date of issue; (2) not filled by the dealer within 60 days from date of issue; (3) issued before February 20, and not presented to a dealer before March 20, or if not filled by the dealer before April 20.
