

UNO Police Force To Be Set Soon

WASHINGTON, March 6 (AP)—The number of men, ships and planes this country may be willing to contribute to UNO's international police force is expected to be decided tentatively within the next two weeks.

Present indications are that the emphasis will be on warships and aircraft, rather than on troops.

The question is in the hands of the joint chiefs of staff. This group of top army-navy leaders is due to come up with some kind of an answer before the March 21 meeting in New York of the military staff committee of the UNO's security council.

Composed of representatives of the Big Five—the United States, Great Britain, Russia, France and China—the military staff committee will be faced at the outset with the problem of determining the size and makeup of the force with which the United Nations will undertake to "maintain or restore international peace and security."
