**Boxers Paid But Also Suspended**  
CHICAGO, March 6 (AP)—Heavyweight Boxers Arturo Godoy of Chile and Lee Savold of Paterson, N. J., got paid for their Friday night bout which was declared "no contest" after eight rounds, but they were ordered suspended indefinitely from most rings of the country.

The suspension, imposed Monday by the Illinois Athletic Commission, means they may be barred for life in Illinois. An Illinois member of the National Boxing Association, commissioners explained the indefinite suspension will become effective in all NBA territory.

Purses of \$6908 to Godoy and \$3754 to Savold were released after the hearing, at which the boxers, their managers, newspapermen and Referee John Behr testified. Behr had stopped the bout.

## Trainer Bounced For Possession Of Drugs

ARCADIA, Calif., March 6 (AP)—Roy Selden, one of the most successful trainers at Santa Anita race track, has been suspended for the remainder of the meeting for what the stewards said was possession of stimulants and hypodermic equipment.

Selden was not charged with doping any of the horses he tends in his public stable, but the stewards contend he violated a section of the California racing code pertaining to possession of any drugs, stimulants, hypodermic needles or other instruments that might be used on horses to affect their speed.

Vigorously denying any violation of the racing rules, Selden said he would fight the suspension to the limit. He said investigators for the stewards had broken a lock on his trunk in a tack room, had removed the trunk without returning it and were "blackening my reputation without just cause."

Selden told of treating a sick mare, Snug H., with three shots of medicine with a hypodermic needle, of getting penicillin and having a groom administer it every three hours, one night a few weeks ago.
