

Scout Week Opens Today

marks the official opening of Scout Week. Thirty local troops along with the county-wide organization will be active throughout the week in a variety of activities. The 34th birthday of the organization is being celebrated on March 12, with a citizenship in Action day.

Tomorrow at 7:30 p. m. the annual night school will be held at the county fairgrounds. Winners of the contest will receive a certificate at that time. The posters made by intermediate and advanced troops will be on display. They will be on display in the stores throughout the week.

The planting of the week's activities will be the tree planting on the courthouse grounds at 2 p. m. Sunday at Juliette Gordon non-sectarian program.

Scouting, open to all between seven and 18 years of age, has grown in membership since its beginning in 1912, to more than 100,000 boys and girls and women at the end of 1945.

The organization maintains a relationship with the movement in other countries through the Girl Guides and Girl Scouts. It also administers the Low World Friendship fund, which is used to promote friendship through the world.

Scouting in Klamath County was organized in 1929. At present time there are 18 troops, 19 Brownie and one senior troop of school girls. There are 735 members in the organization.

The organization has grown sufficiently in a few years to warrant the appointment of a full-time executive secretary, J. C. McConahy, and a full-time secretary, Mildred C. Kirkpatrick.

Army Men May Reenlist In Same Service Branch

Enlisted men of the army of the United States, at the time of discharge, or within six months thereafter, may enlist in the grade and branch of service in which serving at the time of discharge.

Former enlisted men of the army of the United States, who are physically qualified and who were honorably discharged, who served since September 16, 1940, and were separated after May 12, 1945, may enlist in the grade and branch of service in which serving at the time of discharge, provided they apply in person at a recruiting station and effect such enlistment in the enlisted reserve corps prior to the 13th of August, 1946.

Individuals enlisted under the above conditions will be permitted to retain ratings such as paratrooper, combat infantryman, and similar technical designations authorized by current war department directives.

The army recruiting office for the Klamath and Lakeview area is located at 219 Post Office building, Klamath Falls.

Gun Accident Fatal To 6-Year-Old Girl

SALEM, March 11 (AP)—Dolores Raymond, 6-year-old daughter of Arvid Raymond, was shot and killed accidentally yesterday by her 9-year-old cousin on the Raymond ranch near St. Paul.

The boy and girl went into a room to play, and found a .22 rifle. The boy picked it up, and it discharged accidentally, the bullet hitting her in the head, state police headquarters said.

She died in a Newberg hospital two hours after the accident.

Citizen Budget Men Named For Set Term

Taxpayers appointed to serve on all local committees in Klamath county to fix budgets for the 1946-47 fiscal year, will be appointed on a new tenure basis under a 1945 state law that becomes effective this spring.

Counties, cities, school districts, and all other tax-levying districts must appoint budget committee taxpayer "freeholders" for one, two and three year periods. This is a change from previous practice of appointing budget committee members to serve for only one year. Directors or the governing body of any tax-levying municipal corporation by resolution must designate one-third of the appointed citizen members of a budget committee, or approximately one-third, to serve for one year, one-third to serve for two years,

SALEM, March 11 (AP)—The South Santiam highway was extremely soft today, with several sections west of Santiam junction breaking up, the state highway commission said.

The daily road report: Government Camp—Overcast, 30 degrees, a half inch of new snow. Total snow 84 inches, packed snow and ice in few sections.

Santiam Junction — Overcast 32 degrees, snowing lightly, two inches of new snow. Total snow at summit 128 inches, at junction 66 inches.

Odell Lake — Overcast, occasional light snow, 27 degrees, 2 inches new snow. Total snow at summit 129 inches, roads normal.

Siskiyou Summit—Some snow fell last night.

Astoria — Lower Columbia highway still closed by slide at east city limits, detour via Tongue Point Naval base. One-way traffic around slide on Mist-Claikanie highway.

Meacham — Roads bare.

SALEM, March 11 (AP)—County welfare officials aired their grievances here today at a meeting with Governor Earl Snell and the State Public Welfare commission.

Representing the counties were officials of the Oregon Association of County Judges.

Some of the judges complained that state aid for public assistance is not adequate, while some asked that the state take over the counties' share of the cost, contending that the counties don't have any say in running the program, anyway.

They also discussed a proposal that the state share part of the cost of supporting homes for the aged in the few counties that have them.

This change in term of service on local budget committees was contained in House Bill 60 of the 1945 state legislature, a bill introduced by Representative E. W. Kimberling, Prairie City, Grant and Harney counties.

The purpose of this "staggered term" membership on local budget committees was declared to be that of making certain that some citizens who take part in budget preparation shall have had previous experience in determining how much tax money should be spent for cost of local government.
