## KFLW Nears Completion; Tests Next

Construction of radio station KFLW is nearly complete, and equipment tests will begin in a few days.

As soon as the tests are completed, the station will await final word from the federal communications commission on specific time for beginning regular broadcasting.

The tests will be conducted for several days, and will consist of measurement of operating wave-length, audio-frequency runs, which will enable the engineers to adjust the equipment for highest possible fidelity, and complete general adjustments to provide operation in accord with postwar standards of engineering practice.

**Full Operation**  
It is expected the station will be in full operation before the end of the month.

The studio is located on the Esplanade street side of The Herald and News building, and the antenna is on the Balsiger building. All of the equipment in the plant is new. The transmitter is of postwar construction, just having been received from the factory, and incorporates many improvements developed during the war years.
