Scout Will Be Chosen For Trip

One Boy Scout from the local council of 36 troops will be selected to represent this area for a trip to the Philmont National Scout camp in New Mexico, the Scout office announced today.

The trip will include a tour of the Carlsbad Caverns, visits to four large southwestern cities, horseback riding and camping at Philmont, and explorations of that section of the country.

Expenses, amounting to \$150 will be paid by the organization. Each troop will choose its candidate by June 30, and each district will then select one of these as district candidate. From the four boys who represent the four districts, one will represent the council.

Requirements are that the boy be at least 15 years old by July 1, a first class Scout, have a medical examination to establish good physical condition, a good Boy Scout in accordance with the Scout law and oath, and he must be an experienced camper and provide himself with camping equipment.

The troop candidates who are not chosen will be qualified to go on an eight-day pack trip to the Three Sisters, scheduled to begin August 19.
