Farmers and "city slickers" jammed the Willard hotel dining room last night for one of the most successful annual farmers meetings ever held by the Klamath Kiwanis club.
Principal speaker of the evening was Henry Hagg, Reedville, Ore., dairyman, who discussed the importance of conserving the farm resources of the country.
"You take care of the soil and it will take care of you," said Hagg.
He said American agriculture had used up its soil resource

largely because of the low margins on which farmers have been forced to operate. They have not had the time or the money to take proper care of their land resources, and have been forced to mine them in order to eke out an existence.
Farming, he said, virtually equals all of the other industries of the nation combined, and it is time for the nation to recognize the importance of farm welfare on a long-term basis.
Bryant Williams, a farmer member of the Kiwanis club, was chairman of the evening. Percy Murray made general arrangements for the meeting.
