Living Units Released For War Veterans

Another let-up in the tense housing situation in Klamath Falls may be effected by the release this week of 107 more military units for veterans.

The 107 units were turned over for veterans Monday, according to C. A. Hayden, project engineer, and following cleaning and inspection, applicants were notified from the waiting list of 152 names. Forty-six families are moving in this week and as applicants are being accommodated more names are being added to the list.

Families of military personnel who have left Klamath Falls have been granted extension privileges of remaining in the units for various lengths of time dependent on whether the men were transferred or discharged and the time limits vary from 30, 60 to 90 days. When these families vacate there will be still more facilities available.

Vets Only
One point Hayden emphasized regarding the dwelling quarters on FPHA projects,

is that only veterans of World War 2 are eligible, and these must have families. There are no accommodations yet for civilians on the projects who have not served in the war, and no accommodations for single men, whether they are veterans or not.

Fewer daily requests for living quarters are being received at the chamber of commerce, since the first of the year, but the situation remains static with about the same limited number of vacancies as before. Persons now looking for housing in Klamath Falls are more permanent than those of the last few years, it was reported, and should make better renters.

This continued shortage of rentable living quarters may be due partially to the fact that many persons who have had places for rent are now putting them up for sale, it was suggested.
