

## Red Cross Workers Asked To Complete Assignments

Mrs. Ted Reeves was the first of the residential corps of workers to complete her district, Klamath chapter of the American Red Cross reported today on weekend activities of the 1946 campaign.

All workers were urged today by Chairman Robert H. Thompson to complete their assignments as rapidly as possible. The quota set for the chapter is \$43,100, largest peacetime mark set for this area.

A thermometer is now stationed at the First National bank, 6th and Main, to show the progress in the drive. The thermometer was built by H. R. Hubbard, Great Northern shop carpenter, on his own time and donated to the local chapter. The gauge will be moved throughout the business district as the drive progresses.

The \$100 club membership was growing with the addition of seven individuals or Klamath firms who have donated at least \$100 to the campaign fund. ## Nephew Of KF Woman Killed

Lt. Allan A. Bynon Jr., 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Allan A. Bynon of Portland and nephew of Mrs. Neal Stewart of Klamath Falls, died in Washington, D. C., late Saturday from injuries suffered earlier in the day in an automobile accident.

Lt. Bynon, veteran paratrooper who saw service in Europe and was twice wounded overseas, was stationed at Fort Bragg, N. C., where he was detailed to prepare a history of his division. He was in Washington on official business at the time of his injuries. The paratrooper's father, a Portland attorney, is ill in St. Vincent's hospital. Lt. Bynon was the grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick S. Bynon of Salem and the late Col. and Mrs. E. Hofer, Portland and Salem. Final rites will be announced later.

## Reds Placed In Key Posts

HONOLULU, March 18 (P)—Maj. Gen. Charles A. Willoughby, intelligence officer for General MacArthur throughout the war, said last night he is convinced communists are infiltrating into key positions in the United States army.

He was discussing the recent transfer of two newswomen from the Pacific "Stars and Stripes" for "negative report" on a loyalty check.

Willoughby told reporters that the placement of certain individuals "started in Washington and went all the way down."

"How and where they are placed is probably by pre-arranged plan," he added.

The tall, dignified ex-military teacher (Fort Benning, Ga.), said the infiltration was most evident in army newspapers.

Willoughby, who escaped with MacArthur from Corregidor to Australia and then went with him to Japan, said the atomic bomb ended the war.

The general is en route to Japan.
