

Watter Of Crash Victim Referred To Ferrying Of 'War-Weary' Planes To US

FRANCISCO, March 21 (AP)—The effects of one of seven victims of Tuesday's B-29 crash today a letter written by the co-pilot of Honolulu-San Francisco bomber which cracked up in the ferrying of "war-weary" planes back to the United States.

Starting "Hi, Diz," it said: "If you are going to ferry any war-weary babies back you'd better make out your will."

"Not that I want to frighten you in the least," the letter continued, "but they are plenty rough."

"I lost a lot of buddies on them. They usually crashed on Kwajalein on the way home."

"But with you as co-pilot, I am sure nothing will happen."

Dated Feb. 18, last, it was signed "Stan."

The four-engined bomber, plagued with engine trouble much of the way here from Hawaii, was one of five being ferried to the mainland. It became lost in the clouds after making the Golden Gate and crashed on a ridge 30 miles east of the army air base it was seeking. All aboard were killed. Names of the victims were being withheld by the army pending notification of kin.

All of the 33 army and navy personnel killed in this and another air disaster Tuesday had been recovered today.

Twenty-six of the victims died when an army C-47 transport exploded and crashed in the snows of the High Sierra near Truckee, Utah, on a regular flight. The last body was located in the drifts today, and identifications are complete, reported Lt. Thomas M. Pickett of the Stockton air base.

Vote Made To Cut Multnomah Majority

PORTLAND, March 21 (AP)—The legislative interim committee has asked the attorney general to draft a constitutional amendment limiting Multnomah county's representation in the legislature.

The draft would be used as a basis for more thorough study, the committee members, who are investigating the need for legislative reapportionment.

Update districts have expressed fear that reapportionment based on population would result in too many legislative seats for Multnomah county.

Mexico To Observe Roosevelt Death

MEXICO CITY, March 21 (AP)—The permanent committee of congress announced today plans for formal observance on April 12 of the first anniversary of President Roosevelt's death. The program will include laying of the cornerstone for a monument in Monterey, where President Roosevelt and President Avila Camacho met.

The committee issued a proclamation declaring that Roosevelt had "acquired spiritual Mexican citizenship" through his advocacy of the good neighbor policy.

Chrome Plant Put On Block

SEATTLE, March 21 (AP)—The Seattle regional office of the war assets corporation announced yesterday the \$500,000 chrome reduction plant 15 miles southeast of Marshfield, Oregon, is being offered for sale.

Now declared surplus, the plant produced 400 tons of chrome oxide at capacity. It occupies a 6-acre site and has 13,500 square feet of floor space.

The announcement also said more than 110,000 items of radio and electrical insulating materials at Auburn and Seattle would be sold at fixed prices, with orders to be received immediately and sales concluded in 10 days.
