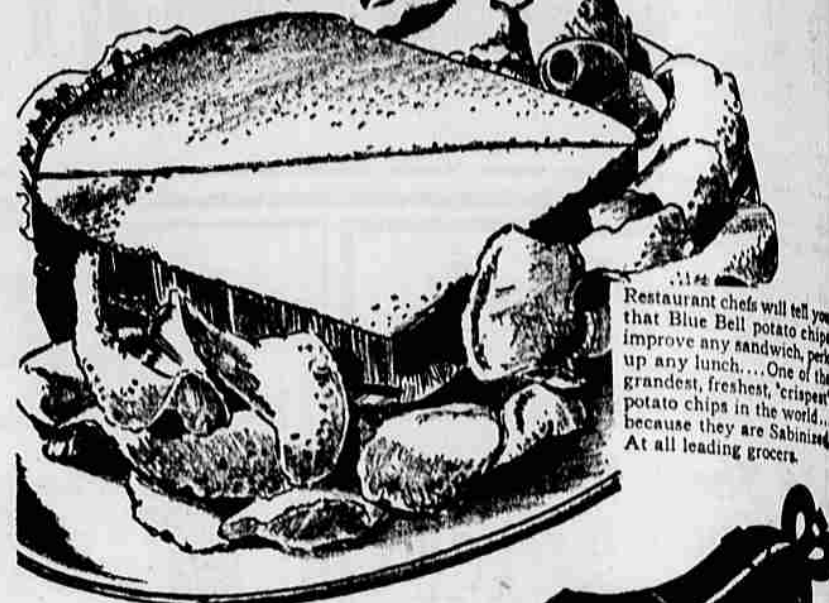
Mr. and Mrs. M. Kruger of Grants Pass have recently purchased the Art Esqate ranch north of Dairy. They are former Dairy residents.

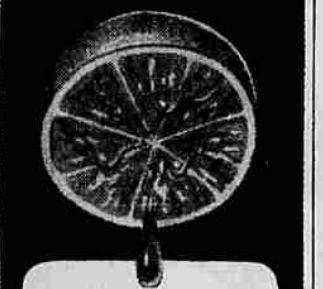
