Weyerhaeuser Plans Camp

OREGON CITY, Ore., March 22 (AP)—J. Philip Weyerhaeuser, vice president, said here that the Weyerhaeuser Timber company, Tacoma, soon will start major operations in Clackamas county, where it owns 28,000 acres.

The firm plans to invest about \$1,000,000 in camp and equipment, he reported, and expects an annual payroll of nearly \$500,000. The logging will be incorporated in a development program centering at Longview plants, Weyerhaeuser said.

Under a sustained yield program, the company plans to cut 35,000,000 feet a year "for an indefinite period," he stated. The logging camp is above Cooper creek bridge in this area.

Joblessness Claims Rise

Returning servicemen and women and a cancellation of war contracts have caused a sharp increase in the claims filed with the state unemployment compensation commission. In order to staff adequately the various offices of the unemployment compensation commission, the merit system council in the Mead building in Portland has announced examinations for qualified applicants for claims interviewers and claims deputies. The commission maintains offices in strategic locations throughout the state and would welcome applications from those who would work in local offices.

Veterans in particular are being sought for these positions, as under the servicemen's readjustment allowance law, usually referred to as the GI bill of rights, veterans who desire to file a claim for readjustment allowance must file at an office of the state unemployment compensation commission. For veterans who have had experience in work related to the duties of these positions while in the service, the merit system council has approved specifications which give credit for this military or naval experience. In addition, veterans are allowed a five-point preference in the examination process.
