WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—The army engineers' north Pacific division, which has merged with the south Pacific division during the war into a single Pacific division, has been returned to its prewar status, the department announced today.

Headquarters will be at Portland, covering the Portland and Astoria districts. It will have jurisdiction over all civil works within these districts and over all military construction and real estate matters for which the chief of engineers has direct responsibility, in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana.

Students Picket Medford Theatre

MEDFORD, March 25 (AP)—The Holly theatre here was picketed by junior high school girls Saturday in a student demand for lower admission rates.

Theatre Manager Lino Hemmela had agreed to discontinue a reduce rate with the girls, but had been advised the youngsters would not select a committee until today.

A student reported the theatre has been charging the full 85 cent adult rate for anyone over 18 years of age. They want a 35 cent rate for persons under 18 years.

The strategy of seeking to destroy the enemy's will to fight by knocking out such means of warfare as industry and port remains, Yamashita noted, but added:

"Now we are about to enter—we seem, in fact, already to have entered—a stage where we don't really need the ground forces at all to reach and attain this strategic objective. Now, with the high speed, long range plane, carrying the atomic bomb, it is possible to destroy virtually all these centers simultaneously and at a single blow."

"The war will be over, to all intents and purposes, even if enemy forces are still in existence, still unengaged and still undefeated."

Air Group To Close Charter

LAKEVIEW, March 25—Hear ye! Hear ye! All ye who wish to fly!

With a membership now having soared to 74, including junior memberships of four students under the age of 16, the Lake County Aeronautic association is looking forward to next Tuesday evening's meeting in the courthouse, when the charter will be closed.

Arrangements are now being made for an elaborate charter presentation ceremony, details of which will be made known later. Next Tuesday night also will witness the beginning of the association's free ground school training for all members. Carter Fetsch, vice president and chairman of the education committee, will open the initial course, theory of flight.

This will be followed, Fetsch stated, by three additional principal courses: civil air regulations, navigation and aircraft engines. All courses will be conducted by fully competent instructors, all of whom are association members. In addition, instruction will be given in aerology, meteorology, parachutes, instruments, radio, and altitude—its effect on planes and personnel.

Classes will be organized at Tuesday's meeting, and plans will be continued to get a model building group under way.
