

# Scientists Find Way To Denature Atom Material

WASHINGTON, March 26 (AP)—The discovery of a way to denature atomic material is reported to have opened up to scientists a new field of research which would render atomic energy useless for bomb-making.

national licensing system to control raw materials and the production of atomic energy for peaceful uses.

**Overshadowed**

But the recommendations were quickly overshadowed by statements from senators credited to Acheson that scientists have learned how to "denature" both plutonium and U-235. These are the substances which furnish the atoms that are split to release vast power.

One senator, who declined to be quoted by name, said the problem of sharing atomic energy secrets with the rest of the world may be "very much simplified" if the process is proved in practical operations.

He pointed out that if a way can be found to control tightly the world's supply of fissionable material and if it can be treated to make it useless for explosive purposes, then there need be little fear of the secret manufacture of A-bombs.

**Long Road Ahead**

But he added that there still is a long way to go—even if the element can be so "poisoned"—to make certain that it could not be manufactured in the original form in which it was used in the Nagasaki bomb. The understanding of all concerned, he said, is that once the plutonium is "denatured," it is extremely difficult to return to its original qualities.

There was a feeling among senators, also, that the reported denaturing discovery may open the way for commercial use of atomic energy.

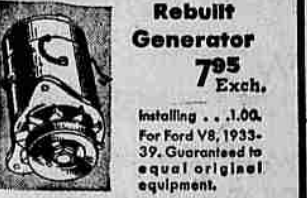

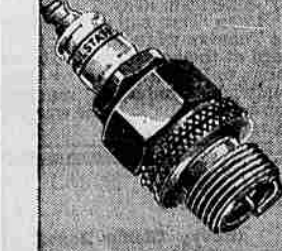
