

Snoqualmie Buried By Snow Slide

SEATTLE, March 26 (AP)—A 1.5-mile stretch of the Snoqualmie pass highway just west of the summit was buried today under 18 feet of snow from Monday's avalanche which also entombed a snowplow and an auto.

Drivers of the two vehicles floundered through the snow to safety after their machines were partly buried by one.

Hardly had they gotten in clear when another avalanche completely covered the car and the car.

OREGON CITY, March 26 (AP)—Mrs. Verna McComas, East Clackamas, was starting two 30-day sentences in the county jail today for neglecting to send her daughters, aged 11 and 16, to school.

Justice of the Peace G. W. Thiesen sentenced the woman in February but paroled her on condition she make sure of the girls' regular school attendance. County Traffic Officer Jack Grenfell, checking on the case, said the girls had been absent 16 days since February.

The daughters will stay with relatives here, and will ride to school with a teacher who lives next door, Grenfell said today.

Atomic End Of U. S. And Russia Foreseen

SAN FRANCISCO, March 26 (AP)—Dr. Irving Langmuir, one of 16 American scientists who visited the Soviet union last year for the Russian academy of sciences meeting, says this country and the Soviets probably will have enough atomic bombs in six to ten years to wipe each other out.

He told an interviewer he estimated the Russians would have their first atomic bombs in three or four years and urged constructive steps toward world government to avert disaster.

Pool Room Ban Stands

A move started by high schools to allow minors in bowling alleys and pool rooms was turned down by the city council last night on recommendation of the recreation committee.

The move particularly referred to the Kern bowling alleys, 6th and Klamath, where liquor is not served, but the councilmen held that any change in the present law would also allow minors to frequent other pool halls and card rooms in the city.

The ordinance stands and will be enforced, the council decided.
