Restaurant Owners Grant Pay Increase

OREGON CITY, March 30 (AP)—A pay increase and 40-hour week are among terms of a new agreement reached here between restaurant owners and the Culinary Alliance local.

The agreement includes time and a half pay for work on Thanksgiving and Christmas, one week's paid vacation for one-year employees and two weeks after two years' work. The new hourly minimum wage is 82 1/2 cents for waitresses, cooks \$1.25, bartenders and fry cooks \$1.
