

Groups Meet To Discuss Plans For Starch Plant

Planning committees of both Klamath and Klamath Potato Growers associations met Saturday to work out plans together for raising funds for construction of the proposed \$150,000 starch and glucose factory in the Klamath basin.

supply, sewage disposal and transportation must also be considered in determining the location.

Final Decision

The final decision will be made by the Northwest Chermurgic Co-op officials, but it will be influenced by stockholders, after their purchase of stock. Arrangements are being made whereby growers may set aside funds for purchasing stock, in escrow in Klamath basin banks until enough stock has been subscribed to go ahead with construction of the plant. In the event that enough stock is not subscribed, funds in escrow would be returned to growers, according to this plan.

It is hoped that sufficient stock will be subscribed by May 1, so that construction may begin on the factory by that date, in order to utilize culls from the 1946 potato crop for starch and glucose.

Housing Group Will Be Named

PORTLAND, April 2 (AP)—The committee to direct the housing area's veterans' emergency housing program will be named shortly by Mayor Earl L. Ray.

The mayor reported National Housing Expeditor Wilson W. 1944 has requested leaders of the building industry, labor and veterans' organizations and representatives of the housing authority and businessmen here be named to the committee to serve two years.

The committee will direct plans to stimulate home building under the program initiated March 26, when the government clamped new controls on building materials and halted non-essential building programs.

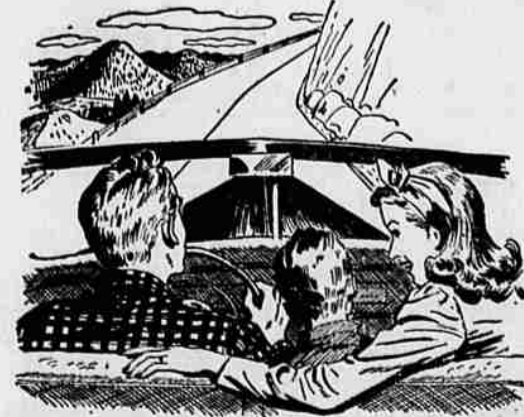

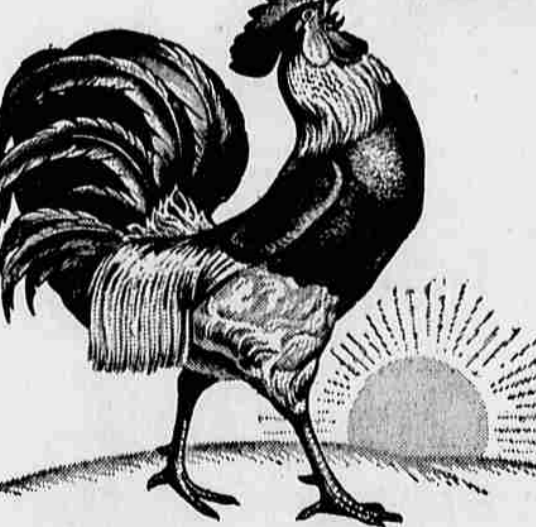
