

# Checkers Will Resume Work

PORTLAND, April 6 (AP)—Union and employer spokesmen announced today CIO checkers and supercarriers will resume work Monday at Beaver, Ore., ammunition docks after a week's strike.

The walkout idled 225 CIO-affiliated longshoremen, who also will return to the job. The back-to-work agreement hinges on renewed negotiations, which will start Monday morning, said R. E. Ferguson, manager of the Waterfront Employers' association. He said several weeks' deadlock resulted because "both sides tied so many reservations to their proposals... but we'll make another start toward reaching an agreement."

R. J. Wolf, president of the CIO local, said he thought the dispute—based on a checkers' request for more pay for handling ammunition—was "just about settled."

# Roseburg Claimed Lumber Capital

ROSEBURG, Ore., April 6 (AP)—Portland lost its status as Oregon's lumber center because of overcutting, and Eugene—its successor—now is "completely shot" for the same reason, an Oregon and California administration official asserted here.

Harry I. Nettleton, O. & C. forester in charge of research, said Roseburg now is the state's lumber capital. He urged that new sawmill developments be squelched, to discourage overcutting. Recommending sustained-yield operations, he said this area's mills now produce about 400,000,000 board feet a year.

ANNAPOLIS, Wash., April 6 (AP)—Mrs. E. Hiller, R. D. 5, said today she had telegraphed the Los Angeles sheriff that she had recognized in an Associated Press picture her silky haired little dog "Cindy," missing here six months. The Los Angeles photograph, published in the Bremerton Sun last Tuesday, showed the little dog being separated from her "boy friend," a big, black-eared dog named Mike which had brought the little stray home with him three weeks ago.

"The caption called her 'Frisky,' but it was 'Cindy,' all right," Mrs. Hiller said. "Any dog owner will tell you they can recognize their own dog in a photograph."

Mrs. Hiller said she asked the sheriff to see that the little dog was saved until Mrs. Hiller could claim her.

The navy said the ship is south of the normal route to Seattle but that nothing had been announced concerning changes in plans to bring the section here.
