

Vocational Addition To KUHS To Be Constructed

Members of District No. 2 school board Monday night instructed Howard Perrin, architect, to complete plans for a vocational addition to Klamath Union high school. The building will be located on MonClaire and Alameda adjoining the present woodworking shop.

Superintendent L. G. Gralapp said yesterday that the proposed four-story building would house auto mechanics, Smith-Hughes agriculture, woodworking, art, and mechanical drawing departments. The present shop will be turned over to physical education as a special activities room.

Robert Hendershott of Bend, now attending the University of Oregon, was named to the physical education department at KUHS and will serve as assistant football and track coach. Hendershott was recently discharged from the navy after four years' service as a commissioned officer.

Also named to take over new duties in 1946, was James Ashbaugh, who will instruct in biology and assist as freshman football coach and also be in charge of boxing. Ashbaugh is now completing work at Oregon State college having been discharged from the army with the rank of major.

Robert Bannister, art instructor at Eugene high school, Eugene, will report for duty in September as general supervisor of art in both districts. He will teach three periods at KUHS and spend the remainder of the time supervising art in city schools. Dorothy Dixon, now at the University of Oregon, was named to girls' physical education.

Staff members added to the elementary schools included, Martha McLoughlin, Reva Snell, Gladys Langslet and Phillip Schwab. Harold Derrah Believed Dead

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Derrah, 1343 Crescent, received a letter from the secretary of the navy Monday, saying that their son, Y 1/c Harold Derrah, who has been listed as missing for a year, must be presumed dead. Derrah was a crewman of the submarine Kite which disappeared in the Marianas late in March, 1945. Word was received on April 16, 1945, that Derrah was missing. The 24-year-old sailor was a native of Wisconsin and was graduated from high school in Wabeno, Wis. Before going into the service in November, 1941, he was graduated from Hill Business college in San Francisco and was employed in that city.
