A display of diversified things from China has caused a good deal of interest among the students of KUHS. This display was recently put in the art case in the right side hall. All sorts of things are shown—some intricately painted Chinese pictures on rice paper, which was secured in Peiping in 1904; Chinese brass, crackle wear, rice pattered dishes, chopsticks, and of course, peijamas and coats of original Chinese origin. Three kinds of different woods are there—bamboo, sandal and teak wood. A beautiful jade piece is also on view.

These things have been brought by the world geography classes. The display will be kept in until Friday, so it will be well worth some of the kids' time to take the long way to class some day in order to see the display. If this display is successful, the class may have a Philippine display, according to Mrs. Joe Peak, World History teacher.

Members of the social economics classes are getting a taste of what it entails to be an adult. They are being required to draw plans of their ideal house. The houses are being drawn to scale and they are planned to be in a first-class building zone. If these houses were to be completed projects they would have to stay in a \$5000 to \$5500 money range. The teachers are limiting the kids to five major rooms.

The factor behind this is the study of housing. The students are going to study it with the idea of clearing of a slum district, or so-called blighted area. Later they will take into consideration all the factors of rejuvenating such an area, including plumbing, lights, water, schooling and such.

LAKEVIEW, April 10—A comprehensive program for the routing of tourists over the Three Flags highway during the ensuing year was developed at the first postwar convention of the Three Flags Highway association, held here Saturday and Sunday.

The Three Flags highway follows U. S. 305 from the Mexican border to Bendleton, Ore., thence proceeds northward over highways 410, 295, 195 and 95, via Walla Walla and Spokane, Wash., Coeur d'Alene and Bonners Ferry, Ida., to Canada.

Feature of the program will be a campaign of education of tourist handlers in each community of the Three Flags route. This will be developed by an association committee which will be appointed in about two weeks at a directors' meeting in Reno.

Chinese Crewmen On Sit-Down Strike

COOS BAY, Ore., April 10 (AP)—The Dutch motor ship Vanderheist was idled in the harbor here by a sit-down strike of Chinese crewmen protesting an immigration bureau ruling refusing them shore leave.

The 46 Chinese, most of whom joined the crew in London, were refused shore leave after three jumped ship at San Francisco where it berthed en route here. The crew members who started the strike yesterday are not regular seamen, officials reported, but emergency workers hired for deck work and as stewards.

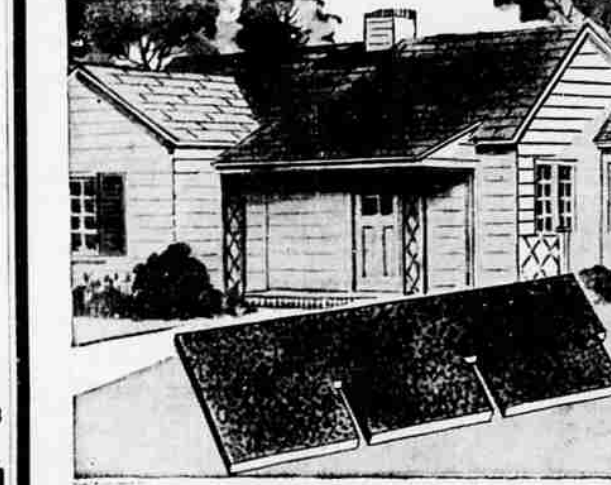

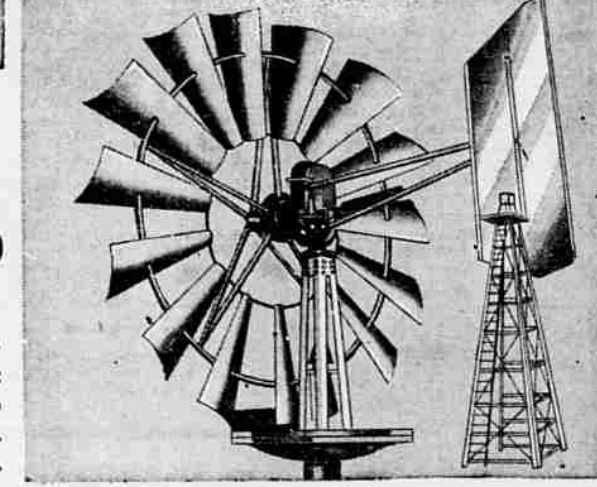

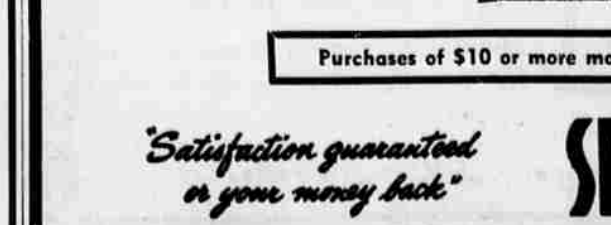
